Dear Parishioners,

In today's holy Gospel, we hear of the vine and the branches. Our Lord's central point is that without Him, we bear little...if anything at all. While there are many who may very well affect the world in a great way without Him, the effect is less than the simplest act of love of God. I often tell the men in my class in Spiritual Theology that the greatest act of philanthropy done by one who rejects God is nothing compared to the humble act of reverence of a child to the Lord in prayer. The former may be valued by the world as infinitely greater than the latter, but our Lord's image of the vine and the branches shows different.

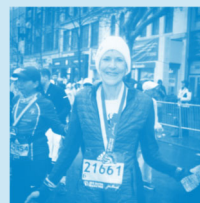
Those with a worldly vision are often blind to eternal values. They do not comprehend the importance of spending time with our Lord on Sunday in communion with fellow Christians to be any more important than sleeping in bed and offering a perfunctory "Our Father" when they deign to wake up. When we read the Old Testament, when Israel defies the Lord or becomes so desirous to sell out to what is the most "politic" to do, they are overrun by invaders, suffer exile, and have to endure a time of trial before they wake up and turn back to the Lord. Do we really believe that the shrinking number of religious is a mere effect of the Church "evolving"? Or could it be that too many have abandoned their charism? Are there less priests only because the Church is "evolving", or could it be due to the fact that families are less open to children, or that priests are so afraid of their present stigma, they feel hesitant to even inviting a young man to think about the possibility? Are the young challenged to see the importance and value of the married life, or do we keep our mouths shut to "keep the peace"? Do we think that our parishes will grow, when we act as if ashamed of Christ and the Gospel? No gimmick, no program, no flashy brochures could ever avail to anything without a sincere faith in the Lord: "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me, you can do nothing. [...] If you remain in Me and My words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and I will be done for you" (John 15:5,7).

May the Lord increase our faith, when amidst the challenges of the world, we are tempted to offer less to Him than what He wills, let alone deserves.

As mentioned in the petitions last weekend, my grandmother, Lillie Faye Teater, passed away, and my family has offered our prayers that the Lord may receive her into eternal life. I wish to offer a particular thanks to the priests, who at last minute, made themselves available to substitute for me here at the parish, the seminary and also for a conference sponsored by the Archdiocese: Msgr. Greg Mikesch, Msgr. James Ramacciotti, Msgr. Pat Hambrough, Fr. Don Henke, Fr. Mark Kramer, SJ, Fr. Paul Hoelsing, and Fr. Jason Schumer. And a big thanks to the parish staff: Dcn. Jim Murphey, Ann Donohue, Debbie Gartner and Kevin Larkin.

My grandmother joins the ranks of many in her generation that did more than what could ever have been expected. May their example inspire us to do even more!

Now that you've paid your income taxes for 2017, you might enjoy knowing some interesting facts connected to taxes:

- ◆ The first income tax ever was in 1404 in England.
- ◆ The first U.S. income tax started during the Civil War.
- ◆ The 16th Amendment, ratified in 1913, established the first permanent U.S. income tax.
- ◆ The estimated revenue from individual income taxes in 2018 is \$1.7 trillion.
- ◆ 90 percent of returns are expected to be filed electronically.
- ◆ \$2,925 is the average tax refund as of March 23, 2018.
- ◆ The timetable for refunds with a paper return is seven weeks.
