
This weekend, we will offer our Parish's Friends for Life Campaign. The Campaign helps to fund RESPECT LIFE programs and services which promote the respect and protection of

Dear Parishioners,

We hear from our Lord this weekend: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the Gospel will save it" (Mark 8:34-35). In these words, our Lord upends the preconceptions of those who believe that He is the Messiah who is to enter Jerusalem and establish a new Israel in a political and military sense, and He reveals Himself to be the Suffering Servant as prophesied by Isaiah, who will bring a deeper healing through His Sacrifice.

This revelation is so scandalous that even His disciple Peter comes to reproach our Lord by foretelling such horrible things, but to the surprise of those who knew His closeness to Peter, the Apostle receives a public rebuke in his own right: "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do" (Mark 8:33). So quickly after his profession of faith that Jesus is the Christ, the Anointed One, the Messiah who is to bring salvation, Peter denies the means by which He has chosen to bring that salvation. He cannot fathom that God would choose such suffering as a way to bring salvation to Israel.

Peter reveals to us a common trait in fallen humanity through his inability to see the value of the Cross, let alone how God would come to experience suffering. This is a great stumbling block for many religions, when they look upon the truth of Christianity. It is impossible for any "god" to suffer in the way that we proclaim happens to Christ. It is bewildering for them to even ponder how a "god" would take on human nature and to die.

In the earliest days of Christianity, there were some who even tried to contort this truth by saying that Jesus only "pretended" to suffer and die, or what the disciples witnessed on Good Friday was merely a "show" of suffering by Jesus who did not really have a human body to begin with. Such thinking as this was an attempt to shape the Gospel in such a

way as to make it more palatable to the times. Since it was inconceivable to think of any "god" suffering, let alone assuming the totality of human nature, then some would contort the reality of Jesus Christ in such a way as to make it more acceptable. Surprisingly, the habits of ancient heresy repeat themselves in the history of the Church. The truth that we all believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God who assumed the totality of human nature and suffered, died, and was raised from the dead, is something that we may take for granted nowadays, and yet, there was a time, when this was denied by even those who called themselves Christian.

Again, such individuals were more constricted by the thinking of the world and still needed to be fully converted to the Gospel. In our own day and age, there are many who call themselves Christian, but because they are overly attached to the thinking of the world rather than the what is revealed in Jesus Christ, they contort the Gospel to be more palatable to the world.

As we come before our Lord today, we pray that He may purify our minds and hearts to receive the truth and to carry the cross which may come from it. Only then, will we be His disciples.

As we continue our pilgrimage through the Season of Creation, we try to take each step mindfully and to contemplate the wonders of Nature that Jesus also

experienced in His earthly journey.

Jesus must have found refreshment by the Sea of Galilee or in the fishing boats of his friends, and we too honor the gift of water, the element which comprises 70% of this precious blue planet. St. Francis of Assisi spoke lovingly of "Sister Water," and Pope Francis reminds us that "fresh drinking water is an issue of primary importance" (Laudato Si', #27).

Action Steps:

- Water is a universal right of all living beings. Reject its privatization: take back the tap and refuse to buy bottled water.
- Waste from factory farms, (the source of almost all meat products), contaminates ground water. Greatly reduce food intake from animals (one quarter-pounder requires 600 gallons of water) and buy from small, local farmers.
- Rivers, lakes, and oceans are choked with plastic pollution which is killing marine life. Refuse plastic straws in restaurants and bring reusable shopping bags to the store.


