

Saint of the Week



SAINT BENEDICT'S STORY Feast Day July 11th

It is unfortunate that no contemporary biography was written of a man who has exercised the greatest influence on monasticism in the West. Benedict is well recognized in the later Dialogues of Saint Gregory, but these are sketches to illustrate miraculous elements of his career.

Benedict was born into a distinguished family in central Italy, studied at Rome, and early in life was drawn to monasticism. At first, he became a hermit, leaving a depressing world - pagan armies on the march, the Church torn by schism, people suffering from war, morality at a low ebb.

He soon realized that he could not live a hidden life in a small town any better than in a large city, so he withdrew to a cave high in the mountains for three years. Some monks chose Benedict as their leader for a while, but found his strictness not to their taste. Still the shift from hermit to community life had begun for him. He had an idea of gathering various families of monks into one "Grand Monastery" to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity, and permanent worship in one house. Finally, he began to build what was to become one of the most famous monasteries in the world - Monte Cassino, commanding three narrow valleys running toward the mountains north of Naples.

The Rule that gradually developed prescribed a life of liturgical prayer, study, manual labor, and living together in community under a common abbot. Benedictine asceticism is known for its moderation, and Benedictine charity has always shown concern for the people in the surrounding countryside. In the course of the Middle Ages, all monasticism in the West was gradually brought under the Rule of St. Benedict.

Today the Benedictine family is represented by two branches: the Benedictine Federation encompassing the men and women of the Order of St. Benedict, and the Cistercians, men and women of the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance.

Reflection

The Church has been blessed through Benedictine devotion to the liturgy, not only in its actual

celebration with rich and proper ceremony in the great abbeys, but also through the scholarly studies of many of its members. Liturgy is sometimes confused with guitars or choirs, Latin or Bach. We should be grateful to those who both preserve and adapt the genuine tradition of worship in the Church.

In the 2nd reading St. Paul said, "**May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.**" In order to be Missionary Disciples, we don't need to be scholars of the faith like St. Thomas Aquinas or St. Augustine! We just need to boast in the cross of Christ by sharing our own relationship with Jesus.

Why do we need to do this? Jesus answered that question in the Gospel when He said, "**The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few.**" When we are truly alive in Christ, we radiate the miracle of what He did for each one of us. We are on fire and can't wait to share the good news. This takes practice and it can be scary at first, but Jesus told His disciples if people don't listen to your message when you speak in My name then wipe the dust off your feet and move on. We shouldn't take it personally, because as Missionary Disciples we don't speak for ourselves, we are sharing the message Christ not only provided to us but the one He died to give.

It would be good to take an opportunity this week to meditate on the what, when, where, and how of our story, as a friend of Christ. Once we do that, it will be much easier to share that story with others.

IS THIS THE WAY LIFE IS SUPPOSED TO BE?

There are times in our lives that we feel like "the hits just keep on coming!" It can be difficult to see anything positive or to have hope. That is when we must dig deep and try to do exactly that. It is certainly easier said than done; yet trying to remain hopeful is what can help us survive.

People have told me, "I don't think God is listening." "I can't pray." "I am so mad at God." "I feel alone. I do not feel God anywhere." Having these feelings, doesn't mean the person doesn't have faith. It doesn't make us a terrible person. It means the person is suffering, is hurting, feeling defeated. I feel honored when someone trusts me enough to share these emotions. I feel when people are willing to share their suffering during vulnerable times, they are in tremendous pain and are trusting me to listen, to be present. I may not be able to change a situation, but I can listen with a confidential and compassionate heart.

I can say, it is okay to get mad at God. That shows you trust that God is real. It shows that there is a relationship with God and you want help.

Amid our physical, psychological, and religious suffering, we can rediscover our relationship with God. Experience tells us and faith confirms that every struggle contains an opportunity to deepen our relationship with God.

When we are hurting, sad or angry, it can be difficult to pray. People do not always turn to their faith. If things go wrong and life isn't what we thought it would be, this isn't a reflection on the power and genuineness of God's love. It doesn't necessarily imply that we have sinned or displeased God. It simply means that the world isn't what it's supposed to be.

If you are hurting, God doesn't want you to put on a "happy face" to cover up your suffering. Tell God what you are really thinking.. No sugar coating. God "promised never to leave you; I will never abandon you." (Hebrews 13:15) He hears you even in the worst of times when He seems silent and absent.


Just give it one try, or in some cases, one more try, and see if you don't feel the calling. Don't let lack of transportation or other obstacles stand in your way.
