LENTEN REGULATIONS

The Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (Wednesday March 6th) and Good Friday (April 19th) are days of abstinence for all Catholics

over the age of 14. **On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59.**

Abstinence means refraining from meat.

Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply. We should strive to make Lent a time of prayer and penance.

Dear Parishioners,

As we take our leave of Ordinary Time, we are left reflecting upon familiar words of the Lord from the Gospel of Luke: "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? [...] For every tree is known by its own fruit" (Luke 6: 41, 44a). The first phrase invites us to a somber reflection, and perhaps a timely one as we head into Lent. How quick we can be to see what is negative in another's life, but we are blind to what is bad in ours. A former president once said at a memorial service for slain police officers: "Too often, we judge other groups by their worst examples, while we judge ourselves according to our best intentions." We fall into a disordered joy in highlighting the failures in those with whom we disagree or who have truly hurt us some way. We can see too many examples of this in social media...and how interesting that those launching such vitriol may think themselves to be "merciful," "open-minded," or "tolerant." As our Lord states at the end of today's passage: "...from the fullness of the heart, the mouth speaks" (Luke 6:45). If we desire to truly be a people of mercy, and therefore faithful disciples of Christ, we should reflect on our speech, if not also our deeds, to truly measure how we are, and how close we are to the Lord or not... and just rank ourselves according to our best intentions.

As we come to Lent, we are encouraged by the Church to enter this time with a spirit of penitence and to engage in special prayers and sacrifices so that the Lord's grace may purify us further. Yet these special prayers and sacrifices could be for the sanctification of others as well. Sometimes, in our devotions, we can have a tendency to look inward and only how they affect us rather than the wider Church and community. What is our desire for this season? Again, the Gospel of this week and also the last offer us good material for reflection. What grace does our Lord desire for us this Lent?

At this moment, I would like to offer a special word of thanks for the many years of service to the

parish of Susan Caruso and all those who have assisted her in decorating the sanctuary and church for special liturgical seasons and events. She will be stepping back from that service, though she has graciously offered to continue organizing the "holy wash" of the altar linens. If you would like to help with this, or perhaps assist the new head of sanctuary decoration, please let me know. Thanks again, Susan!

Also, the Festival Committee, a.k.a. "Food Truck" Committee, is searching for possible leads for underwriters for the Food Truck Party that will be this coming August 24th. If anyone has suggestions of solid possibilities, please let me or one of the Committee members know.

Finally, let us pray for one another and the Church. In my own mind, admittedly, I would have like to have heard a lot more from Rome this past week, but to be fair, only so much could be said or done in a few days. I would encourage all, though, to read an upcoming article from our Rector, Fr. Jim Mason, who was invited by George Weigel to contribute an article to the *First Things* magazine, which is generally a solid publication.

Phone consultations – Can address health related questions, senior care options, and financial concerns.

Care Management – The goal is to keep seniors independent and safe in their homes by providing comprehensive needs assessment and safety checks by an Elder Care Specialist. Resources, referrals, and other information are included in these visits.

Senior Benefits Program – Aging Answers is able to help seniors identify, apply for, and access benefits, such as Medicare savings programs, tax assistance (Circuit Breakers), medication assistance, and Veterans' programs. With this service, seniors can save up to \$500 annually. Qualifications include age 60 or older and live in the city. There are no income restrictions.

Financial Assistance for Church Workers and Missionaries – Available through the Eliezer Fund, provides assistance with in-home care services, medical equipment, medications and nutritional supplements.

Good Neighbor – A financial assistance program for those needing home-based, non-medical services to remain independent. Assistance through Good Neighbor pays \$10/hour toward the cost of Lutheran Senior Services Private Duty Services.

Volunteer Money Management – Helps seniors manage their financial tasks so they can remain independent. Each participant is matched with a volunteer who meets with the senior at their home on a regular basis to help with money management tasks.

Lutheran Senior Services aging Answers Department is a free resource for seniors and provides an array of services.
