I thought you should know - December 13, 2020

It is almost time for Christmas? Are you excited? I am looking forward to seeing lots of people at Church this week! We want to welcome people here and help them pray on that holy day, and we also want to keep people safe.

I'm very grateful for the way everyone coming to church has been cooperating with a good heart in the safety precautions we have: wearing a mask, and staying spread out. Our area continues to have a high volume of cases. What is more, I think some people are going to be coming to church on Christmas for the first time in a long time. So, I want to ask you to take special care to look out for each other and keep everyone safe by responsible choice. I know that wearing a mask is troublesome for lots of us, and that some people have health issues that mean they can only wear a mask for a short time. That being said, since we'll have music at all the Christmas masses and we want everyone to join in our carols, I would sincerely ask and highly recommend that on Christmas you wear your mask not just while you come in and go out of church, but also while you are seated in your pew, if at all possible.

Below I've put the third week of our "Peace on Earth" message series. From Kevin, Debbie, Deacon Jim and myself, and from all our wonderful volunteers, a blessed end of Advent and a Merry Christmas to you and those you love!

Bob Capstick worked at the Post-Dispatch and attended mass at St. Lawrence parish in North St. Louis County. He loved the Holy Spirit and had committed prayer. He heard the Holy Spirit tell him to start a youth group. He protested to God that he had no training to start a youth group. Nor did he have any commission from his pastor or support from his parish. The Holy Spirit kept pushing him to start a youth group. He started God's Gang in his basement. First a few and then many teen gathered in his basement once a week; hearts changed there and wounds healed and young men and women met Jesus and learned he loved them. From that youth group came youth leaders and worship leaders who went on to bless even more. All because a man named Bob was sent by God; and Bob did not quench the Holy Spirit.

When we pray well, the divine power of the Holy Trinity, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Trinity falls down into our hearts. They enlighten, inspire, and direct us, and blessings go out from us for the healing, blessing and salvation of many others. That's why St. Paul today coached us on our prayer life in this way: "Do not quench the Holy Spirit; do not despise prophetic utterances."

Here at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish, we are spending these weeks preparing for Christmas learning to pray well. Our idea is that if we prepare for this Christmas by learning to pray well, we can taste God's peace even when this Christmas is weird, and we can carry away from this weird Christmas a permanent gift to make all our future Christmases better. So, we've invited everyone to make a commitment to daily prayer, and we are also using a part of every homily for some guided personal prayer. So let's pray now. Can I invite you to please close your eyes, if you don't mind, and follow along with this next part in your heart?

Let us remember that we are in the Holy Presence of God. <Pause> Let's look back on the last day, the last 24 hours, and whatever was good in that day, let's give God thanks for it in our heart. <Pause> Let's look back on the last day, the last 24 hours, and whatever was bad in that day, wherever we sinned or missed the mark, let's ask God to forgive in our hearts. <Pause> Let's look to the days ahead, to the weeks ahead, and whatever we would like God to bless, whomever we would like God to help, lets bring him those people and those situations now in our heart. <Pause> Now, if you can, if you can, tell God in your hear, "I love you." <Pause>

Ok, you can open your eyes now, if you want. Thank you for taking time to pray.

If you haven't made a prayer commitment for Advent, there is still time; God is good and he can work very fast in our hearts when we start to let him in. From today, we have 12 days to Christmas; why not make them special by taking a little time each day to pray?

If you have made a prayer commitment, it might be that you have already seen some blessings from God in your daily prayer. Last week we talked about what to do when it is hard to pray, when we are distracted or when we just feel

empty and tired and filled with doubts, and that message is in this week's bulletin. One of the big messages from last week is that your prayer can be very powerful and very pleasing to God even when it is hard for you. For example, if you are distracted 8,000 times in prayer and 8,000 times you turn your mind back to God, you prayed really well. So the main way we evaluate our prayer life in the short term is simply by our faithfulness to prayer. Whatever commitment you made: did you keep that commitment? If you did, in a basic and important way, you prayed. However, prayer is not all struggle; prayer has times when God is blessing you lights, desires and resolutions. That's our topic for today.

The "lights" I am talking about aren't visions or lights that you see in your eyes or picture in your minds eyes. I mean the light of wisdom coming into our mind, giving us new insight into God the Father, into the mysteries of Jesus life, into the love of the Holy Spirit, insights into our Catholic faith or into our daily life. This increased understandings sometimes can be hard to put into words. Maybe we can compare it to the way that a loving married couple understands each other and their marriage better after 50 years of good times and bad than they did on their wedding day. It might be hard for them to put into words all that they have learned, but they know their love is so much deeper and they know each other so much better than they did on that first day of marriage. In a similar way, through committed prayer, God gives us lights in prayer that increase our wisdom, perspective, and understanding, taking us deeper in to faith, hope and love.

Besides lights, a second blessing that can come in prayer are "desires", good and holy desires that come from God. You might have in prayer a desire to pray more tomorrow, or a desire to be more patient or more courageous. You might find your heart hungry to be a really good friend to others, or burning with new fire to keep a good promise you made. Holy desires are a big, powerful blessing in prayer, because by holy desires God lines up our wills—I mean, our power to choose—toward the choices that will help us and bless others.

A third blessing that can come in prayer are "resolutions". The Holy Spirit in prayer will point out to us ways he wants us to live or things he wants us to do. Most of the resolutions that show up in my daily prayer are small things that are specific to that day, but that make a big difference when I do them, like calling a certain person or prioritizing a certain task or going to bed at a certain time. Sometimes, though, like with Bob Capstick or with John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit points us towards a big change or a big project.

What do you do when God is blessing you with lights desires and resolutions? You try to keep up! I mean, the Holy Spirit does not have to move slowly, and if God is moves really fast in your life, and you are growing, you just try to keep up! Let me give you four ways you can respond to blessing in your prayer life, the little ones, and then the one big one. First, thank God for the gift; remember that this came not because you earned it, but because he loves you so much and is so generous in response to our little efforts. Second, be steady, remembering that a time will come when prayer is harder, and when that time comes, you want to be faithful. Third, keep praying; be careful to keep honoring your prayer commitment. Fourth—and this is the big one—carry with you out of prayer and into the rest of your life the blessings God gives you in prayer. If God gives you a resolution, keep it. If God give you a holy desire, look for chances to live it out. If God gives you a new light, bring that insight into your life.

Brothers and sisters, I invite you pray each day this week. Keep your prayer commitment, and look for some right or desire or resolution coming from the Holy Spirit, when that blessing comes, take action.

Did you feel a desire to help someone, to be patient or say a kind word? Do you find yourself out of the blue, feeling at peace? That my friend is the power of prayer! That is the Spirit working. Do not quench the spirit. Allow God to flourish within you.

It is exciting to grow in a relationship, to become closer. It is a lifelong commitment. My prayers will be with all of you.

Saint of the Week



Saint Stephen
Saint of the Day for December 26

Saint Stephen's Story

"As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Greek-speaking Christians complained against the Hebrew-speaking Christians, saying that their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, 'It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word.' The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit..." (Acts 6:1-5).

Acts of the Apostles says that Stephen was a man filled with grace and power, who worked great wonders among the people. Certain Jews, members of the Synagogue of Roman Freedmen, debated with Stephen, but proved no match for the wisdom and spirit with which he spoke. They persuaded others to make the charge of blasphemy against him. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

In his speech, Stephen recalled God's guidance through Israel's history, as well as Israel's idolatry and disobedience. He then claimed that his persecutors were showing this same spirit. "...you always oppose the holy Spirit; you are just like your ancestors" (Acts 7:51b).

Stephen's speech brought anger from the crowd. "But he, filled with the holy Spirit, looked up

intently to heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God, and he said, 'Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God.' ... They threw him out of the city, and began to stone him. ... As they were stoning Stephen, he called out, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.' ... 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them'" (Acts 7:55-56, 58a, 59, 60b).

Reflection

Stephen died as Jesus did: falsely accused, brought to unjust condemnation because he spoke the truth fearlessly. He died with his eyes trustfully fixed on God, and with a prayer of forgiveness on his lips. A "happy" death is one that finds us in the same spirit, whether our dying is as quiet as Joseph's or as violent as Stephen's: dying with courage, total trust and forgiving love.




