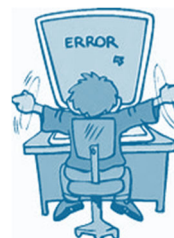

God bless you all! The fourth installment of our "Renewed" homily series is below.

A year ago this week we entered a strange season. At least, that's when it began for me, on March 16, 2020, when the Archdiocese suspended public masses to slow the spread of COVID. It's natural to ask, then or now, "What is God doing?" Answering that sort of question takes perspective—and honestly, probably more perspective that we have right now, just a year out." But our reading's today and our current homily series on covenant give us a great opportunity to think deeply about "What the Lord is doing".

If you've been here in Lent, you've heard me say that covenants are promises that God makes to people to unite those people to himself, to make them his family, and to save them. Through the covenants, we learn what God is doing in history, and why he is doing it. Now our first reading surveyed a vast sweep of history—at least 400 years—and found something constant through all that time. Through all those centuries' frustrations and victories and defeats, the Lord chose to be faithful.

For centuries, as his people rejected him by sin and disbelief, the Lord chose to be faithful. His mercy spared them the full consequences of their sins, and he sent messenger after messenger and prophet after prophet to warn his people and tell them to repent. While his people rejected him, the Lord chose to be faithful and work for renewal.

Then, when disaster was imminent, for another whole generation, the Lord chose to be faithful. As the fall of Jerusalem drew near, the Lord sent Jeremiah as a prophet, telling people that even then they could repent and change the course of history. Jeremiah told King Zedekiah, the last king before the exile, how Zedekiah could save Jerusalem if he was willing to trust God. But King Zedekiah was afraid of what people would think, so he did nothing. And Jerusalem was destroyed.

And then for seventy years more, while the temple was destroyed and our ancestors were in exile, the

Lord still chose to be faithful. He sent Ezekiel with a message that even in exile, the Lord had not abandoned or given up on them, that even in exile, their choices still mattered, and that despite exile, a time would come for renewal. And for those seventy years the Lord protected and preserved them as a remnant among the nations.

Even that wasn't the end. In the return from the exile for another generation the Lord was faithful and pushed his people to make their renewal about more than material prosperity and going back to the way things were. He promised them blessing and protection if they would rebuild for him, and as they rebuilt, he blessed and protected them. Indeed, the story goes on and on, from generation to generation. The whole story of the bible is the story of the Lord's choice to be faithful to his covenant, to keep his promises in good times and in bad.

That great story came to fulfillment in Jesus Christ. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish, but might have eternal life." Jesus life and death was the definitive sign of the Lord's faithfulness, and he gave us the Eucharist as the enduring sign of his faithfulness. Generation after generation, year after year, season after season of life, Jesus is here with you and Jesus is here for you, on your side. So here's the conclusion I draw for 2021, in the middle of Lent, one year after the lockdown: in every season of life, whatever is going on in the world, whatever is going on in your life, you can count on the Lord to be faithful.

In seasons when we are drawing closer to God, his grace is at work, rebuilding and renewing us in the covenant blessings. But also in seasons where we are going away from God, the Lord sends messengers to draw us back from disaster and the Lord promises that forgiveness is open and our choices can still make a difference for good and there can still be renewal. That's why Paul could write with such conviction to the Ephesians about the good the Lord intended for them, though Paul was a big sinner and all the Christians in Ephesus were sinners, too. Paul knew that in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Lord had chosen to be faithful. So Paul called God "rich in mercy" and wrote "by grace"—i.e., not because you earned it—"you have been saved ... that in the ages to come he might show us the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus ... for we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them."

In the face of Christ's faithfulness, we have a choice. We can believe in him and love him and choose to follow him as disciples. Or we can reject him and go another way, with all its sad bad consequences. The Lord is certainly faithful. He has shown it over so long a time. Given that the Lord is faithful, what will I do? Will I believe in him and return to him by repenting of sin and going forward in his love? Or will I keep on rejecting his messengers and giving up on his promises, and wasting his renewals until I die like that and that's the last word on my life? May it not be so.

Let me conclude with something straightforward and simple. Why not put on your calendar a time to go to confession? Confession is humbling, sure, and can look challenging, but it's straightforward and simple. You show up and be honest, and the priest takes the rest from there. In my life, there are few times I feel closer to God than after I make a good confession. And this is a great season to schedule a time for confession, because there are lots of extra opportunities. I put some in my bulletin column, and I bet you can find more on the internet. Brothers and sisters, as you pray at this Eucharist, I invite you to ask, "What's going on? And how is the Lord choosing to be faithful?"

THE LORD HEARS US

In today's second reading; Hebrews chapter five: "In the days when Christ Jesus was in the flesh, he offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to the one who was able to save him from his death and he was heard because of his reverence." During the time of Jesus's incarnation, he experienced all the trials of humans. His body and human soul, just like ours felt pain, love, disappointments, rest and fatigue, joy and sadness, he was human with the exception of sin. Jesus's humanity allows him to sympathize with our weakness and suffering.

Now more than ever people are experiencing great sadness, worries and anxiety. May we trust that we are not alone. Listen for a message during Mass, during your prayer time, throughout the day.

Our Lord, incarnate, provided us with the example of faith in God's presence. Knowing that he could always talk to him, shout and even cry. We too can do this in confidence that God will hear us. He will also speak to us. Listen for the Lord, he communicates with us during our prayer, when we receive Eucharist, in Scripture, nature, through others...be open to God's messages.

Communication with God can be spoken out loud, said within your heart, written in a journal, or sung from your soul, However you feel closest, allow that interaction between you and God. When I had my aneurysm/stroke I was in ICU, I remember not being able to pray in sentences, I couldn't remain focused. What I remember praying: "Help me Jesus." "Lord help me." Those three words, sometimes repeated over and over, brought me peace. I know I was heard. I have offered this to several people who are experiencing anxiety or fear. Whichever way you choose to communicate with God, know that you will be heard.

Saint Oscar Romero's Story

The night before he was murdered while celebrating Mass, Archbishop Oscar Romero of San Salvador said on the radio: "I would like to appeal in a special way to the men of the army, and in particular to the troops of the National Guard, the police, and the garrisons. Brothers, you belong to our own people. You kill your own brother peasants; and in the face of an order to kill that is given by a man, the law of God that says 'Do not kill!' should prevail.

"No soldier is obliged to obey an order counter to the law of God. No one has to comply with an immoral law. It is the time now that you recover your conscience and obey its dictates rather than the command of sin. . . . Therefore, in the name of God, and in the name of this long-suffering people, whose laments rise to heaven every day more tumultuous, I beseech you, I beg you, I command you! In the name of God: 'Cease the repression!'"

Simultaneously, Romero had eloquently upheld the gospel and effectively signed his own death warrant.

When he was appointed archbishop of San Salvador in 1977, Bishop Romero was considered a very "safe" choice. He had served as auxiliary bishop there for four years before his three years as bishop of Santiago de Maria.

Oscar's father wanted him to be a carpenter—a trade for which he demonstrated some talent. Seminary classes in El Salvador preceded his studies at Rome's Gregorian University and his ordination in 1942. After earning a doctorate in ascetical theology, he returned home and became a parish priest and later rector of an interdiocesan seminary.

Three weeks after his appointment as archbishop, Romero was shaken by the murder of his good friend Jesuit Father Rutilio Grande, a vigorous defender of the rights of the poor. Five more priests were assassinated in the Archdiocese of San Salvador during Romero's years as its shepherd.

When a military junta seized control of the national government in 1979, Archbishop Romero publicly criticized the US government for backing the junta. His weekly radio sermons, broadcast throughout the country, were regarded by many as the most trustworthy source of news available.

Romero's funeral was celebrated in the plaza outside the cathedral and drew an estimated 250,000 mourners.

His tomb in the cathedral crypt soon drew thousands of visitors each year. On February 3, 2015, Pope Francis authorized a decree recognizing Oscar Romero as a martyr for the faith. His beatification took place in San Salvador on May 23, 2015. He was canonized on October 14, 2018.

Reflection

Oscar Romero and many other Latin American martyrs for the faith were falsely accused of advocating a Marxist-inspired "theology of liberation." Following Jesus always requires choices. Romero's fiercest critics conveniently dismissed his choices as politically inspired. An incarnational faith must be expressed publicly.
