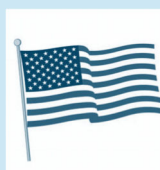

Hello! My name is Fr. Aaron Nord. I am the new priest for Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish. I am very excited to be here--more about that in a moment--and eager to meet everyone. If you have a moment, stop by after church today to say hello. Rather than have a reception in the parish hall or an open house at the rectory, I'm going to be at The Haven every Saturday in August from 6 pm till 8 pm having dinner. If there is an open seat at my table, feel free to join me. If the seats are full, stop by to chat. Since some of you have ideas, questions, or business to discuss, I've set aside some 9am-11am on Tuesdays and from 1pm to 2pm on Sundays to meet with parishioners. You can make an appointment through our wonderful pastoral associate Debbie or simply drop by and see if I am free.

Most of all, I am very excited to serve at Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish because Jesus is with us. He is with us in the Eucharist each Sunday and in our tabernacle throughout the week. He heals us in Confession and he teaches us in his Word. There are so many people in our neighborhood we can help meet Jesus and believe in Him, and that possibility excites me, because when we help the lost and the little to find Jesus, they find eternal life. Also, I'm excited because Msgr. Billing told me Immaculate Heart of Mary parishioners really impressed him; I've certainly been impressed by the staff and volunteers whom I've met.

My best personal prayer time usually comes when I'm in church reading a little of the bible, talking to God and thinking and then being quiet for a while.

Saint Cajetan

Saint of the Day for August 7

Saint Cajetan's Story

Like most of us, Cajetan seemed headed for an "ordinary" life—first as a lawyer, then as a priest engaged in the work of the Roman Curia.

His life took a characteristic turn when he joined the Oratory of Divine Love in Rome, a group devoted to piety and charity, shortly after his ordination at 36. When he was 42 he founded a hospital for incurables at Venice. At Vicenza, he joined a "disreputable" religious community that consisted only of men of the lowest stations of life—and was roundly censured by his friends, who thought his action was a reflection on his family. He sought out the sick and poor of the town and served them.

The greatest need of the time was the reformation of a Church that was "sick in head and members." Cajetan and three friends decided that the best road to reformation lay in reviving the spirit and zeal of the clergy. Together they founded a congregation known as the Theatines—from Teate [*Chieti*] where their first superior-bishop had his see. One of the friends later became Pope Paul IV.

They managed to escape to Venice after their house in Rome was wrecked when Emperor Charles V's troops sacked Rome in 1527. The Theatines were outstanding among the Catholic reform movements that took shape before the Protestant Reformation. Cajetan founded

a *monte de pieta*—"mountain or fund of piety"—in Naples, one of many charitable, non-profit credit organizations that lent money on the security of pawned objects. The purpose was to help the poor and protect them against usurers. Cajetan's little organization ultimately became the Bank of Naples, with great changes in policy.

Reflection

If Vatican II had been summarily stopped after its first session in 1962, many Catholics would have felt that a great blow had been dealt to the growth of the Church. Cajetan had the same feeling about the Council of Trent, held from 1545 to 1563. But as he said, God is the same in Naples as in Venice, with or without Trent or Vatican II. We open ourselves to God's power in whatever circumstances we find ourselves, and God's will is done. God's standards of success differ from ours.

South City Deanery PSR Registration

Registration for 2020-2021 South City Deanery PSR year will be held in the St. John the Baptist Parish Center Monday, August 17, 2020 from 6pm – 8 pm and Sunday August 23, 2020 from 11 am – 1 pm. The \$35.00 registration fee is due when you register. Please bring a copy of your child's Baptismal Record for our records.

SCD PSR program provides formal Catholic religious education (Pre K to Confirmation Prep) for the children in parishes of the South City Deanery. Sessions are on Monday evenings, September through May from 6:20-7:40 PM

Our program continues and supplements the religious formation from parents, who are the first teachers of their children in the ways of the faith. We assist families in the areas of knowledge of the faith, beliefs and Christian life skills and religious practices, and strengthening the growing relationship with Jesus and his Church.

First Reconciliation & First Communion is usually done as part of the 2nd grade curriculum. We also have preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion for students grades 3-8 **Students must be in the PSR program for two years in order to receive First Reconciliation and First Communion.** Confirmation is usually done in the 8th grade and above. **Students must be in the PSR program for two years (Pre-Confirmation and Confirmation classes) before being confirmed.**

The Garden of Innocents What-Where-Why

The Garden of Innocents is two things. It is a group of caring people acting on the belief that every person is a child of God from the first moment of their existence and that they deserve to have the respect and dignity due them.

It is also a place, a place in Calvary Cemetery where, thanks to the generosity of Msgr. Robert McCarthy and Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, abandoned children are laid to rest.

That's the reason for the Garden of Innocents. Living out her Catholic faith, St. Peter-St. Charles parishioner Rebeca McKelvey filled a previously unmet need. She learned that when babies who have died are abandoned by their families, they were buried without the dignity and respect every person deserves. Without any rudiments, even clothing, they were buried in unmarked graves. She brought together like minded folks to provide what was needed to honor these innocent souls and express the love of God they enjoy together with all his creation.

Today, although the Garden of Innocents has provided over 40 burials for these special children of God it remains a little known ministry in our midst. Realizing that there are many folks in our parishes who would be eager and willing to support this ministry the Garden is reaching out with this information.

There are many ways you can be a part of this ministry. First by supporting it with prayer. You can also get on the Garden's email list to be notified when a funeral takes place and attend the funeral joining in honoring these children. If your skills include knitting or sewing, you can contribute by donating the items used to lay these children to rest. Dynamic Catholic, Alive! – No Gift is too Small

The feeding of the five thousand is a reminder of two important ideas in being good stewards of the gifts that God has given us. First, when problems arise, God calls on us to be part of the solution. We should absolutely ask the Holy Spirit for guidance, but we must also be willing to act, even if that means being put in an uncomfortable position or doing something that others may not understand at first. Second, no gift is too small or insignificant in God's plan. Too many times we use the excuse of "I don't know how to do that", "I don't have enough time" or "I don't have enough money" when invited to participate in the mission and ministry of the Church. Know that God is calling each of us in the present moment and in our current circumstances into a loving relationship with Him. Your generosity at that specific moment may be the answer to someone else's prayer.
