

Dear Parishioners,

In today's readings, we hear of the universal mission of the Church, which is to include not only those of the Chosen People of Israel but also the Gentiles. While the salvific plan of God began with the formation of Israel, the ultimate goal was to embrace the whole human race. As St. John reports to us in Revelations: "I, John, had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands."

The symbol of the palm branch is an ancient sign of those who were witnesses to Christ through their martyrdom. Throughout many churches and places of Christian conversion, one can see the palm branch as a sign that proclaimed their fidelity to the Gospel even to death. However, there are also signs of the palm upon the sarcophagi of Christians who did not necessarily die as martyrs, but nevertheless desired to show in some fashion their union with Christ and those who did witness to the Lord in that fashion.

In any case, St. John sees that these witnesses to the Gospel came from all sorts of backgrounds, which shows that God desires all of the human race to be saved, though it is up to us to receive that grace and persevere in it through our witness to Him and His Son.

As mentioned last week, I will be returning to fulltime ministry at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. My specific position which was announced last Monday is that of the Director of Spiritual Formation. This largely entails the planning of the annual retreats and days of recollection at the seminary as well as taking on a number of the men in spiritual direction. For the past nine years, I have been what is called a Formation Advisor, who in layman's terms is like a "drill instructor" who is to keep tabs on each of his assigned men and to guide them in their formation as seminarians and report to the rector of his progress throughout the year, and in a more formal way, in a final evaluation report at the end of the academic year, which will be forwarded to his vocation director and bishop.

The Spiritual Director operates in what we call the "internal forum" which means that what the seminarian discusses with him remains only between them and God, much like the Sacrament of Confession. It offers a space for each man to completely bear his soul, which places a lot of responsibility upon the Spiritual Director to guide each man along the path that God is revealing to him, so that he may progress in his union with the Lord and offer himself to the Lord's plan for his life. Needless to say, this is a special honor to walk with the seminarian and a great trust.

The date of new assignments is June 25th, after which I will be in residence at the seminary. Please pray for me and Msgr. Billing as well as all our new-ly ordained priests, that we may be faithful to where God has called us and grow as shepherds according to His Heart.
