I thought you should know – April 11, 2021

Happy Easter! As Catholics, we celebrate Easter for eight and fifty days. Not fifty-eight days but in double special way for the eight days in the Easter octave and also for the fifty days in the season of Easter. Below you'll find the homily I gave on Easter Sunday. As I mention there, it has been a blessing to me to see signs that the season of pandemic is starting to close—so let's stay safe, get vaccinated, and be careful till the pandemic is only a memory!

A mistake on my part generated a big problem with our livestream on Easter. My apologies to anyone who tried to tune in and found that it did not work. We'll be back livestreaming Sundays at 10 am, God willing. A special thank you to Greg, Annette, Karen, Debbie, Jim, Susan, Darlene, Ladonna, Al, Elizabeth, Roxanne, Joyce, and Matt and everyone else whose generous service made Easter beautiful!

As we prepare for more activity on our campus, it's important that Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish renews our Safe Environment Program, so we do our part in protecting our children and vulnerable adults. A wonderful parishioner, Karen Hall, has volunteered to serve as our Safe Environment / Child Safety Coordinator. I've really enjoyed working on this project with Karen because of her friendliness and diligence. She's taking on this big task to help me and all our leaders protect our vulnerable parishioners, pass our yearly audits, and spread the Gospel. So, please give Karen your full support if she contacts you because you're a member of one of our parish groups which is completing its Archdiocesan required training.

Finally, if you love helping out at our parish or if you have been thinking about helping out at our parish, I encourage you to get ahead of the game and participate in the Safe Environment Program training. Just by getting trained you help us care for others, renew the church, and prepare to serve those in need and welcome families to our campus. You can for more details about how sign up for the training at the end of this week's bulletin. God bless you!

In the last year my dad had the misfortune of reading the great first two books of the Kingkiller Chronicles. The Kingkiller Chronicles are a big fantasy trilogy by Patrick Rothfuss, something like the Lord of the Rings, less famous, to be sure, but with many ardent fans. It was my dad's misfortune to read the first two books of the series, because fans have been waiting for the third book to be released for **over ten years!** Now imagine the reaction of my dad and Patrick Rothfuss' other fans if the third book of the series was released after the pandemic was over, and they discovered that the author, in a "bold artistic choice" had the series main character appear nowhere its concluding story! Patrick Rothfuss would have to stay in quarantine, because mobs would be looking for him! The Church has made that sort of "bold artistic choice" in selecting the gospel we hear this Easter morning, a gospel about the Resurrection of Jesus in which Jesus never appears.

Now I don't want to mislead anyone. Christian faith does assert that the Resurrection was a real event. The stone was not rolled away only in myth, nor was the tomb empty by a trick of the light, nor was the cloth that covered Jesus' head rolled up by a hallucination. Those were fingerprints left on history by a real event. And in other reports of the Resurrection, Jesus does appear, first to his close friends, later to more than 500 people at one, and finally even to one of the Church's enemies. Yet rather than give us any of those stories this Easter morning, in a "bold artistic choice" the Church gives us this strange story about that little slice of life from the time after Jesus rose from the dead and before the disciples understood what was going on, before they had it all figured out. I wonder if perhaps this year, because of the strange year we've all lived through, we can understand this strange story a little better.

I'd like to share with you one of my experiences during the pandemic, but before I do, let me acknowledge that many of you had a far more difficult experience than I. Maybe you got furloughed, or lost multiple friends to COVID, or had someone you love pass away when people could not visit them. My story is a lot more mundane than any of that, but I'd like to share it with you in the hope that something about my experience can help you understand your experience a little better.

A year ago, when the lockdown had just started, I was not coping well. Maybe I could have coped better, probably I should have done better, but in fact I was beat up inside by anxiety and confusion, and so what I was doing

was spinning my wheels, generating all sorts of plans and ideas and contingencies and ways to stay in control, all of which were more work for those around me, and none of which actually were helping anyone, especially since none of us knew what was going on and things were changing every day. Eventually a good brother priest whom I worked with sat me down and told me that I was adding a lot of stress to his life in what was already a very stressful time!

That event, that conversation interrupted my life and made things better. It wasn't that I understood everything after it, or that after the conversation I had everything figured out, but it did change my direction and put me on a better path, so that I focused on something a lot simpler and a lot humbler, but also a lot more productive and a lot more rewarding. I started calling people to see who they were doing and listen to them and ask if they needed prayers.

There was a big grace from God in that conversation. Before I understood, before I had things figured out, the Lord interrupted my life and gave me a new start and put me on a better path. And looking back on the last year, I see that pattern again and again. Over and over the Lord interrupted my life and changed by direction for good. Was there anything like that for you during the pandemic, a moment when some event changed your life for the better, before you had everything figured out, before you understood what was going on?

John tells us that the disciples' experience of the Resurrection was like that. John confesses that he and the other disciples "did not understand the Scripture that [Jesus] had to rise from the dead". The disciples could have understood that Jesus would rise from the dead; they had all read the scriptures. The disciples should have understood that Jesus would rise from the dead; Jesus himself and foretold it. Yet the days before the resurrection had beat them up in side, so that they in fact did not understand what they could have and should have.

At first, Easter just made everything more confusing. Mary of Magdala was frantic because she thought Jesus' body had been stolen. Peter and John's miserable morning became a hectic one as they ran around and tried to figure out what happened. The other disciples heard from women who had visited the tomb and found themselves confused by the news. Yet the news was good news, the greatest news. For Jesus had risen from the dead, not just in an idea or a teaching or in a spiritual insight, but as a real event interrupting history and changing its direction. The resurrection was a real even that interrupted the life of the disciples before they understood it, and what's so great about that is that meant that all those circumstance that prevented them from understanding, those things that had beat them up inside, **did not matter** because the Lord God and acted and was acting in history, before they understood what he was doing, before they had it all figured out. John told us about the moment when he start to realize this, about this time before he saw the Risen Lord, when he had just seen signs of the resurrection in the empty tomb. He saw, and believed.

What can we take away from this story for the weeks ahead? If you are like me, you are eagerly awaiting the end of the pandemic; sure we have to be careful for a while, and we need more people to get vaccinated, but we are seeing hopeful signs. And if you're like me, you've started to think about what you want to do when the pandemic is over, like visit friends and have a big party. Can I invite you, as the pandemic ends, to also look for new kindness you could do. Maybe it's reaching out to the family member or friend from whom you've become too distant, and inviting them to lunch. Maybe it's finally signing up to help with that charity fundraiser you've been meaning to get involved in for the last four years. Maybe it's going one time to serve a meal at a soup kitchen that is ramping up to full capacity. So often in life we hold back from trying something new and good because we don't have things all figured out and we don't completely understand where the good deed might lead us. But in the light of Jesus' Resurrection, isn't that as much a reason to try new kindnesses as to hold back from them? The Lord is at work in the world, and the power of the Resurrection continues to interrupt history, to lead us close to him and deeper into his life. So as the pandemic loosens, don't over-think things or hold back from chances to do new good deeds.

Can I conclude by adding one more thing to the list of things you could try? This one might be the one that makes all the rest possible, and turns a lot of "could-do's" into "did's". And this one, you could do today. I invite you to address the Lord in prayer before you understand him, and to worship God with us before you have everything figured out.

Saint Teresa of Los Andes Saint of the Day for April 12

Saint Teresa of Los Andes' Story

One needn't live a long life to leave a deep imprint. Teresa of Los Andes is proof of that.

As a young girl growing up in the early 1900's in Santiago, Chile, Juana Fernandez read an autobiography of a French-born saint—Thérèse, popularly known as the Little Flower. The experience deepened her desire to serve God and clarified the path she would follow. At age 19 Juana became a Carmelite nun, taking the name of Teresa.

The convent offered the simple lifestyle Teresa desired and the joy of living in a community of women completely devoted to God. She focused her days on prayer and sacrifice. "I am God's," she wrote in her diary. "He created me and is my beginning and my end."

Toward the end of her short life, Teresa began an apostolate of letter-writing, sharing her thoughts on the spiritual life with many people. At age 20 she contracted typhus and quickly took her final vows. She died a short time later, during Holy Week.

Known as the "Flower of the Andes," Teresa remains popular with the estimated 100,000 pilgrims who visit her shrine in Los Andes each year. Canonized in 1993 by Pope John Paul II, she is Chile's first saint.

The special graces given Saint Teresa reflect the

mysterious wisdom of God at work in individuals whether young or old. It appears God has his own logic when it comes to who gets what in the realm of grace. All we can say is; "Praised be the Lord."
