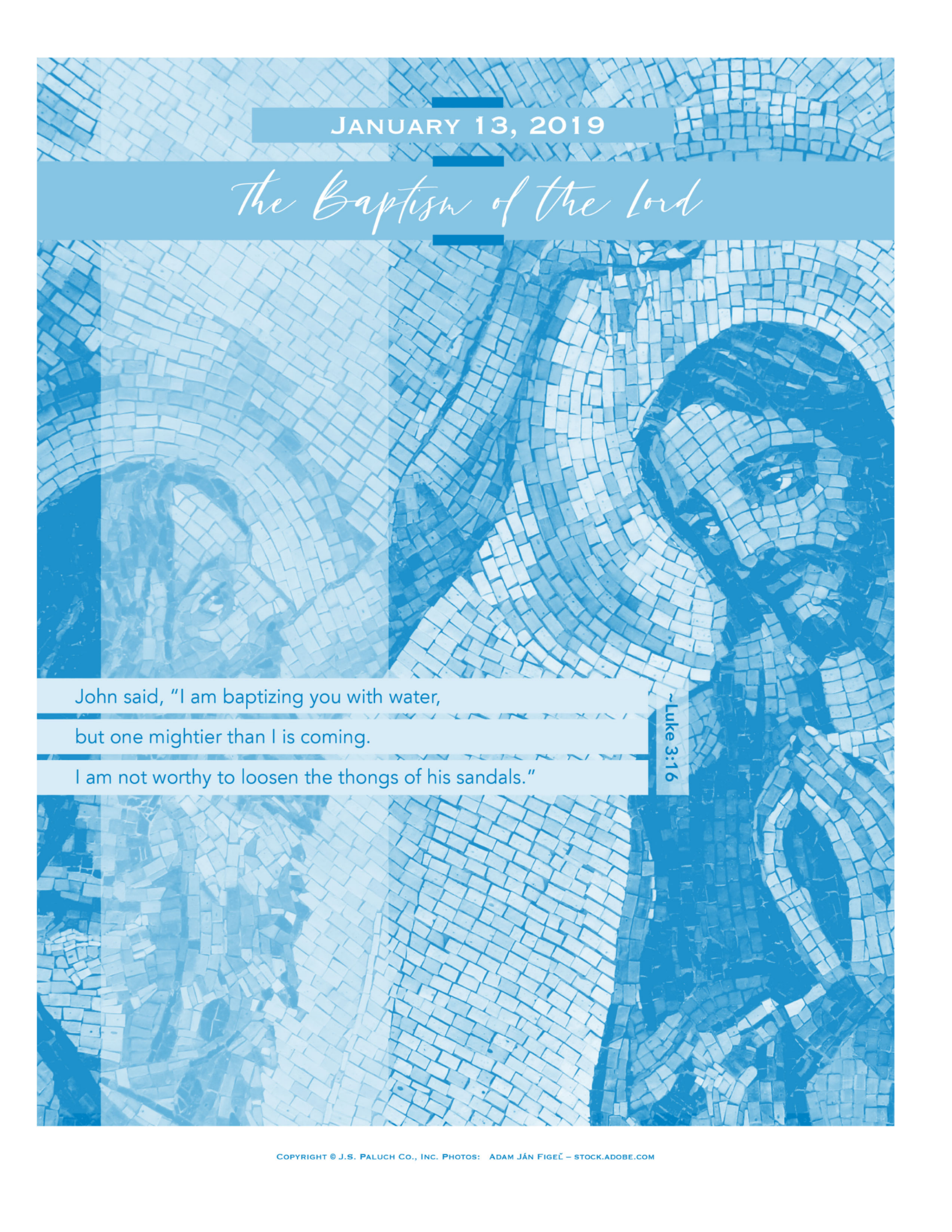

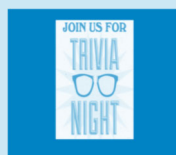

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord this weekend, we call to the event, when our Lord submitted Himself to the hands of St. John the Baptist to be immersed in the waters of the Jordan, as an outward sign of His dedication to the plan of the Father. Although He was sinless and had nothing within Himself to be cleansed, Jesus recognized that this was according to the plan of the Father to bring salvation to humanity. In receiving the obedience of His Son, the Father manifests Himself to those present, and He reveals Jesus as His Son "in whom He is well pleased."

This exchange between the Son and the Father happens within the context of baptism and includes the human cooperation of St. John the Baptist. It is a sign of what happens to those who are baptized in the Lord. Though we continue to use water as an outward sign of the spiritual cleansing that is taking place in the sacrament of Baptism, it is truly the Lord who is baptizing with "fire and the Holy Spirit." The image of fire conveys a power that consumes and gives light. Through the sacrament, the Lord's action consumes the guilt of sin and enlightens the soul with His presence and grace.

The sacrament is only a beginning, though, as it is the start of a new relationship between the baptized and God. Initiated in the life of God, the Christian is marked as a child of God; one adopted by grace to share in the relationship of the Son to the Father. It is an awesome dignity, which demands our cooperation. Baptism changes us, but it does not take away our freedom. God the Father desires us to freely engage what we have been given, particularly when we reach the age of reason.

As we recall the Baptism of the Lord, we also remind ourselves of our own baptism, its gifts and the call to respect and mature in the life of grace given to us by divine Providence. May the Lord guide us to follow His Way that ultimately leads us to the Father.

As we end the Christmas season, I wish to again thank all of those who have helped prepare the parish for this time of year, whether through decorating the church, assisting in liturgies or holding celebrations for our parish organizations. Please God, let the New Year bring us the necessary grace and blessings to pursue the Lord's Will for us. Let us continue to pray and work together in living out our faith as children of God!

SENIOR MOMENTS

ALLOW JESUS TO WORK WITHIN US AND THROUGH US

Last month we celebrated the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ. He was born and became God incarnate, John 1:14 says, "*The Word, the eternal God Himself, became flesh.*" Jesus the incarnate came to us for several reasons. A few being that He needed to be born and minister here on earth to spread the news of God's Kingdom and to instruct others on how to do the same.

As we begin this new year of 2019, may we take time to reflect, "*Am I spending time in prayer that I may get to know myself and embrace the Holy Spirit that dwells within me? By going inward, Jesus, show me opportunities to go outward. How do you want me to live my life? Instruct me in ways to bring hope, peace and compassion. Amidst the sadness, negativity and tragedies in my world; help me to spread Your love and to have the courage to make the world a better place by example. Amen.*"

I would like to share a meditation adapted from a Franciscan expression of the Beatitudes written by Capuchin Br. John Francis Samsa, "*The Beatitudes of Christ: Embrace the Challenge.*"

To help you to be inspired, think of those who have offered you hope. Learn about people in our world who live their lives to gratuitously offer assistance and hope to make our world a better place. They bring the Incarnate Jesus into the world.

Here are a few people to help you begin your quest: *Blessed are the poor in spirit. Theirs is the reign of God.* **Dorothy Day** — a Catholic with communist ideals; preached socialism and women's rights; pacifist; journalist challenging church and government policies.

Blessed are the non-violent. They will possess the Earth. **Takashi Nagai** — exposed to radiation from the bomb that fell on Nagasaki; preached forgiveness and reconciliation until his death; amid the destruction he spoke only of the love of Christ; spoke of disarmament as moral obligation.

Blessed are those who mourn. They will be comforted. **Jean Donovan** — fun loving; twenty-seven years old, grew up in a fashionable suburb, loyal Republican, Catholic, engaged to be married; She had a special place in her heart for the children. Jean was a lay Ursuline volunteer in El Salvador; raped and murdered for distributing clothes and

food to those most in need in that war-torn country.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice. They will be satisfied. **Msgr. Clement Kern** — Catholic priest; conscience of Detroit; opened his church to alcoholics, illegal immigrants, gays, and social protesters; supported labor unions and lived Catholic social teaching.

Blessed are the merciful. They will receive mercy. **St. Mother Teresa** — fed, clothed, cleaned and comforted the sick and dying on the streets of Calcutta (Kolkata); founded a religious community dedicated to this same work.

Blessed are the pure of heart. They will see God. **Catherine de Hueck** — pioneer among North American Catholic laity in implementing social doctrine; insisted that action be rooted in prayer; advocated making faith an integral part of ordinary life; bridged Eastern and Western Christian traditions.

Blessed are the peacemakers. They will be called children of God. **Martin Luther King** — rooted in faith, gave hope to oppressed people; saw achieving racial equality as a duty for each person; courage to stand undefended when attacked; jailed and beaten; advocated non-violent strategies in opposing injustices.

Blessed are those who suffer persecution for justice's sake. Theirs is the reign of heaven. **Bishop Oscar Romero** — priest of El Salvador; allowed himself to experience the suffering of his people and the indifference of the political leaders; spoke of a revolution of conscience, of love and justice; shot down while presiding at the Eucharist.

I am grateful for all those who live the Gospel. May the New Year invite us to go ever deeper, encountering the divine within so that we have the wisdom and courage to act out of our authentic selves. We can make a difference in our families, social circles, parish, city, state, country and maybe even in the world. Making a difference can come from small acts as well as those which are profound. We can never underestimate the way in which God will work within us, through our invitation. Blessings to your 2019!

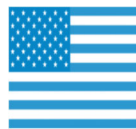
