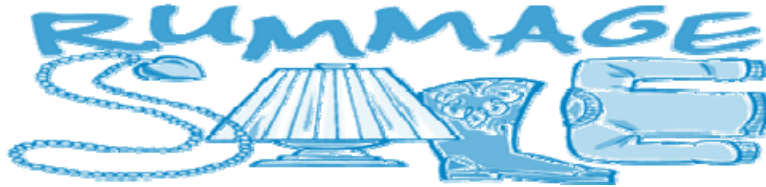

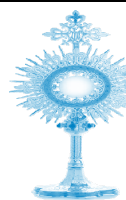

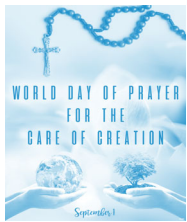

The bin on the upper lot collects items for St. Vincent DePaul thrift store, which keeps items from being thrown away, while helping those in need and the SVDP society. Our Rummage Sale is huge for repurposing as well as earning money for the parish and building community! Parishioners donate gently used clothing and shoes for Peter and Paul Shelter. It is in the caring for humanity that we are also caring for God's creation.

Dear Parishioners,

In the Gospel, we hear of St. Peter's profession of faith in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. Our Lord confirms his faith: "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father" (Matthew 16:17). This means to say that Simon has received the gift of faith from God Himself that raises his vision to go beyond purely the natural observation of Jesus to perceive that He is no mere prophet, but He is the true Son of God who has come to be Messiah, the fulfillment of the prophecies of God's salvation. While we may look at the natural means by which God's divine Providence allows for the communication of the faith, e.g. family, interaction with practicing Christians, etc., they do not take away from the fact that it is ultimately a gift from God. The Church understands faith to be a virtue that is infused within the soul to raise the mind in such a way as to perceive and embrace that which has been revealed by God. We talk of the "eyes of faith" and how we "walk by faith and not by sight" to convey how this gift guides us with a higher light than that which can be ever given by natural reason.

The gift of faith does change one's worldview and how he or she understands everyday events. Faith enable us to look at the consecrated host and recognize the Presence of the Risen Christ, and so deeply can it affect us, that even our natural emotions may react to a truth presented to the soul by the light of faith. Not a few Catholic faithful have expressed to me how empty churches seem to be when the Blessed Sacrament is not present. While they enjoy the fervent proclamation of what is true of the Christian faith when visiting the places of worship of Protestant communities, they perceive the lack of the Eucharist. As we know from her life, while a Protestant, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was blessed with the grace to perceive our Lord's Presence in the tabernacle of a family friend's private chapel while she was in Italy, and this assisted in

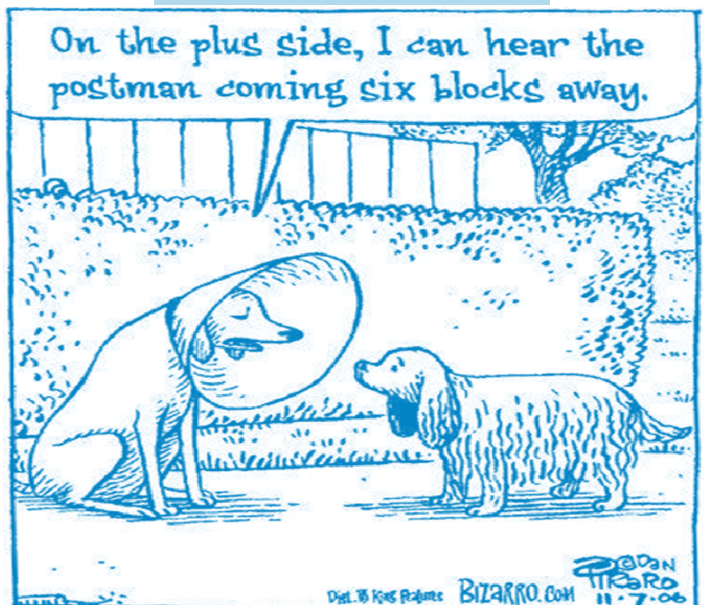
her conversion despite all the difficulties that came with it. After receiving her first Holy Communion in 1805, she wrote: "At last...at last, GOD IS MINE AND I AM HIS! Now, let all go its round-I Have Received Him."

As faith enabled St. Peter to perceive that along with the human nature of Jesus was the divine nature of the Son of God, we also know that he held it imperfectly, given his denial of our Lord at the time of His Passion. Just because we may have the gift of faith, we recognize that our fallen nature has yet to submit itself completely to this gift. Pride, fear, avarice, lust, ambition, etc. can all tug at our hearts and obscure the pure vision of faith such that we may take our eyes off the Lord and sink as we recalled how Peter did in the Gospel reading a couple weeks ago.

Along with the gift of faith is the challenge to remain true to what we understand by its heavenly light. May the Lord grant us also an increase of hope and charity with the faith that He has given us, that what we see in His Light may be confidently held in hope and lived with charity that comes from His Sacred Heart.

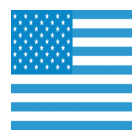
