Dear Parishioners,

In today's holy Gospel, we hear of our Lord sharing His mission with His disciples, sending them out two by two and granting them the authority to cast out demons and to bring healing. These basic signs of the Messiah, who was prophesied to free us from the tyranny of the Enemy and to heal the effects of our turning away from God, continue through the life of the Church. Although we only rarely hear of miraculous healings, they do occur. Many may question, then, why do they not always happen at the simplest prayer uttered by the afflicted or someone interceding on their behalf. We must recognize that Divine Providence, as it has been revealed to us, is ordered to what is best for us, even when it has to weave our lives amidst the sins we commit and those committed by others. If God's Will is that we are miraculously healed due to our prayers or the intercession of another or through the sacraments of the Church, then He has chosen to do so, so that we are brought further into union with Him and progress towards the salvation that He desires for us. At the same time, we find many instances where people have come to the same end, i.e. further into union with God and closer to heaven, by carrying their cross faithfully. In either case, Providence desires what is best for us, and that is union with God. So, whether healing comes to us or the strength to bear a cross is increased, the ultimate goal is heaven...not just having a comfortable life on earth.

What is amazing, though, is that Christ gives a share of His authority to human beings, who are fallible and limited. The generosity of the Lord is matched by the weight of responsibility that it brings to those who are called to share in His mission and authority. There are many hazards in the ministry that try to turn the attention of those called to this mission away from their responsibility: ambition, worldly concern, disaffection, depression, critical souls, etc. Some, like the prophet Amos, find themselves in a situation that they are told to go away because of truth that they are called to bring. All

the more important is it for us to pray for them, that they may be faithful and to encourage those whom we perceive the call to share in Christ's priestly mission.

As we come to share in the holy Eucharist, we pray that the Lord may continue to work His salvation in our midst and convert the souls of those who faith has become tepid or cold.
