**LENTEN REGULATIONS**

The Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (Wednesday March 6th) and Good Friday (April 19th) are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. **On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59.**

Abstinence means refraining from meat.

Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply. We should strive to make Lent a time of prayer and penance.

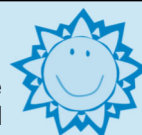

Dear Parishioners,

The Gospel of St. John tells of the woman caught in adultery and the mercy shown by the Lord. Many have meditated upon what the Lord was actually writing on the ground as her accusers grumbled against her: perhaps writing their own sins on the ground to shame them openly; a Scripture verse condemning false accusations or something about the mercy of the Father; or mere scribbling. No one knows what He might have written on the ground, but His point is clear: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Even though they might not have been guilty of the same sin, they were nevertheless guilty of sin themselves, as revealed by the Lord and their walking away.

Perhaps our culture could learn something from this scene. It is odd that the dark side of our culture will tempt people towards certain sins, and once they have given in, it turns on them and mocks or condemns them as quickly as it first encouraged them to sin. This is a common tool of the Enemy, who knows our weaknesses and lures us into falling away from God, and as soon as we flinch and give in, he is the first to accuse us of the evil that we have committed. This is not to deny our own culpability or those who have committed sins, but this is to note how often those who encourage us to walk away from the path of God are usually the first to ridicule us for doing so.

While our Lord does not rationalize the sin of the adulterous woman, He does offer her forgiveness and a return to communion with God and the community, such that if she does receive His mercy well, the sin that she has committed will have no claim on her life. To be merciful is not to rationalize or make excuses why someone has committed a sin, but it means to be ready to offer a path away from sin and towards a fuller life unburdened by its weight. Mercy mourns the sin, but it seeks a better life for the sinner.

"Thank you, Lord, for loving me where I'm at. Thank you for knowing my heart is in the right place. Please help the rest of me catch up with those desires to spend more one on one time with you."

Volunteer Spotlight - Immaculate Heart of Mary "Bingo!"

Everyone in the Soulard Shelter shuffles. Some people clap, while others groan in disappointment. Everyone turns to a new sheet and gets ready for another round of Bingo, as the winner accepts a small prize.



Thanks to long-standing volunteer group Immaculate Heart of Mary, this is what the second Thursday and third Friday of every month looks like at the shelter. The group, which has been volunteering with our agency for over five years, is well known among residents as being the Bingo group.

Organizer of the group, Juanita Bishop, was first introduced to Peter & Paul Community Services through Washington University, where she worked. Her and another staff member organized a volunteer day and headed down to the Soulard Shelter to serve a meal. She says it made an immediate impression on her. *"There was good communication and serving the meal was organized," says Juanita. "But also the staff and the residents were so nice and friendly. That's what really stood out."*

Determined to come back to the program, Juanita decided to try and involve her church, Immaculate Heart of Mary. With her friend Debbie Gartner, who works for the church, the two approached Father Brad Modde, with the idea. He loved the idea of the parish being involved. Soon the group grew in members, and Fr. Brad began allowing a special quarterly collection to be used on meals, clothing and other necessities for those at our shelter. After Father Brad transferred to a new parish, Father Teater continued the plans.

The group serves a variety of meals but is best known for serving its famous fried chicken because, as Juanita states, *"it's their favorite!"* Juanita loves not only serving the meal, but also the opportunity to sit with the residents to get to know them. *"No one is a bad person, they've just been dealt a bad hand,"* she continues. She says working in mental health for 12 years is what originally drew her to our cause.

"I think that everyone should volunteer at least once to see that there are people in this world who need our help," she says. *"I can't explain how good it feels to come down here. It's in my heart and it's what God wants."* Juanita Bishop
