Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, the Church celebrates the Birth of St. John the Baptist. The dignity that he shares comes from his place in salvation history as the Precursor of our Lord, the Forerunner who will proclaim Jesus as the Lamb of God, the one who has come to the world for the salvation of humanity. Given his dignity, and especially the fidelity with which he carried out his vocation even to his death, the Church celebrates his birth in a special way and has placed his birth at a point in the astronomical cycle where the length of light in the day begins to shorten. St. Augustine sees the use of the natural symbol of light as a fitting sign of the Baptist, who states: "He must increase, and I must decrease" (John 3:30). Thus, as the sun begins to diminish, we call to mind the birth of the light of St. John the Baptist that comes before the Lord. As the brightest light among the prophets foretelling the coming of the Messiah, the Baptist recognizes that when the Christ begins His public ministry, it is time for him to fade. Although St. John the Baptist dims before the Light of the World, his mission and memory remain a constant star by which we can navigate our lives and come closer to Jesus Christ.

Given that this symbolism started in the northern hemisphere, the sign has to change a bit to make sense to our brothers and sisters in the southern hemisphere. For them, they see St. John the Baptist as the "little light" and Jesus as the "greatest light," since the birth of the Baptist occurs around the time of the shortest day of the year, while Christmas is around the longest. While we may huddle indoors looking out in the darkness of winter with the hope of new life, our Christian brothers and sisters "down under" are on the beach celebrating that new life. In either case, the symbol of light is a means by which to show the importance of St. John the Baptist as well as His place before the Source of all Light, who is the Christ.

As we come to close of one fiscal year and enter another, I would like to announce that the

Archdiocese is giving us a \$5000 share of the Ensuring Parish Viability Grant to help with our infrastructure. This will be injected into our Parish Maintenance Fund this fiscal year, which will help us recover further from our recent projects with the school/gym boiler and the new daily Mass chapel renovation. I have extended our thanks to the Archbishop and the committee that makes the final decisions regarding how those funds will be dispersed.

Finally, an opportunity for the parish has recently come to our attention. It will be important for me to get your feedback. A representative from Collective Solutions, LLC has approached us with the news that Sprint is interested in erecting a cell tower in our area and our sight is an attractive possibility. Collective Solutions, LLC have given us some renderings as to how this would look. I will have those images available in the vestibule of church. The contract would have to be negotiated through the Archdiocese, and it may come to \$15000 a year for the parish. In any case, this is ONLY in the initial stage, and I will keep you all informed. They may find another place or decide to not continue this project.
