## GAS AND ELECTRIC BILL ASSISTANCE

The Missouri Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is designed to help pay heating bills for those Missourians in need of assistance now through the month of March. If the head of household and/or spouse are over 60 and/or disabled, the application can be sent now. Eligibility for benefits under this program is limited to households who: are responsible for paying home heating costs; are U.S. citizens; do not have available resources in excess of $\$ 3,000$; and meet specific income guidelines that vary according to household size.

For one person, monthly income cannot be greater than $\$ 1,356.75$. For a household size of two, the monthly income limit is $\$ 1,827$. Please contact Debbie 481-9385 for the application or to receive help applying for this program.

Joe Biden offers Hope in Grief Work Shops I discovered a quote by Joe Biden, who served as our 47th vice president from 2009 to 2017. Joe Biden has lived through heart breaking, unimaginable tragedy. His first wife and thirteen month old daughter died in a car crash just a few months after the twenty-nine year old was first elected to the U.S. Senate in 1972. His other two sons were seriously injured in the accident. His grief was tortuous. He felt anger, loss and so much more. In 2015 his fortysix year old son died after battling brain cancer. Again, experiencing devastating loss and heartache! Joe has spoken of his grief publically and through a book that he wrote after his son's death: Private Grief and Its Effect on a Public Life.

This quote has been shared when he offers workshops or speaks on grief: "There will come a day I promise you, when the thought of your son or daughter, or your husband or wife, brings a smile to your lips before it brings a tear to your eye."
Through the many emotions, pain, suffering and hopeless feelings, he has been able to find hope and to offer hope for others.


Dear Parishioners,
At the beginning of Advent, the Church meditates on God's preparation for the coming of the Son in this world and His ministry in the figures of Mary and John the Baptist. With the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, we see how from the first moment that she existed, Mary was prepared by God to be the Mother of His Son by infusing within her soul the life of grace that He would win for us on the Cross. All things being present before the eye of God, which sees all that is within Himself as well as everything between Creation and the End of Time, there is no stretch in thinking that He would apply the merits of the Cross to Mary, even though from our point of view that is locked in the order of time, it had not happened yet. Perhaps what is most important to ponder, though, is how God would prepare her to receive the gift of His Son on behalf of all of us in order that we might share in the newness of life that she would enjoy from her conception. She was put "at enmity" with the devil, as prophesied in the Book of Genesis, meaning that Mary would be separated from the Enemy's power and consecrated by God with His grace (See Genesis $3: 15$ ). While this first grace was unmerited for her, as it is for all of us, it would be through her cooperation with grace throughout her life that would conform her even more to Him. We do not know of the temptations that she endured, but it would be reasonable to imagine that this blessed human creature intrigued the Enemy by her resistance of him, remaining beyond his deceptions and desire to corrupt all of God's works. While we give thanks to God for what He had done for Mary at her conception, we also praise Him for keeping her faithful throughout her life and for her generosity of taking on the special vocation for which He had prepared for her.

We also consider in these days the person of St. John the Baptist, whose coming would be foretold as well, such as in the prophet Isaiah, from whom we hear this weekend: "A voice cries out: 'In the
desert, prepare the way of the Lord! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God!'" (Isaiah 40:3) Again, we see another person, who would be prepared to introduce the Son of God to the world. Though he would not be preserved from the stain of original sin like the Blessed Mother, he would nevertheless enjoy a closeness to God due to his special place in salvation history. God instilled within him gifts that would assist him in his vocation, and through John's fidelity, they would flourish and prepare the world for the revelation of the Son of God. His life was not an easy one, but John was filled with a desire to remaining true to his calling of calling people to repentance and conversion.

Though we do not have the special vocations of the Blessed Mother and John the Baptist, we all have our part to play in salvation history, and all of us receive gifts to assist us. Like Mary and John, it is up to us to respond to the gifts we have received. May their example and prayers, let alone those of others, help us prepare to meet the Son of God face-toface.
