Dear Parishioners,

In today's holy Gospel, we hear of Jesus' return to Nazareth after teaching in various synagogues in the area, and how his reputation also spread. When coming to the town, where He grew up, it must have been with some anticipation that those who knew Him as a child, then saw Him enter the synagogue. It is interesting that Jesus did not start out there to begin with, but as we know, "a prophet is not without honor except in his own homeland" (Mark 6:4). There would be some shock when He read the passage from Isaiah - "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor..." (See Isaiah 61) – and then say: "Today, this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21). They had seen Him grow up in that town. They knew Him... or at least, they think that they did.

God came to us through what we would see as ordinary. Even though He had been with them for years, some in Nazareth did not know Him. Of course, to be fair, the time to reveal Himself would not come until He was an adult, but stories of His birth and the events surrounding it must have been known by some, if not His presentation at the Temple and the words of Simeon. In any case, when the time had come, and He read those words from Isaiah, there were mixed reactions, which we will hear of next week.

While God can come to us through ways that compel our acceptance that it is truly Him, He continues to come to us through ordinary ways much like He did at Nazareth. The scene offers us a lesson in this, and how we should be ready to receive Him in any way that He comes to us.

One common means that the Lord does come to us, is through the members of His Mystical Body, the Church. St. Paul teaches the Corinthians about the close unity that all of the baptized share by using the image of the human body, which is constructed in such a way that although we may be called to exercise different vocations in this life, we are ultimately bound together. We all reflect Christ

and share in His mission to bring fallen humanity back to the Father. We may not think about this, but it is a truth. Through our daily lives, even at the most mundane moments, we are called to be "little Christs" – the original meaning of the term "Christians." It is usually through the most ordinary events of life that we come to meet Christ. If we learn from the reactions of the people of Nazareth, we will be better prepared to accept how He comes to us...rather than shocked and disbelieving that anything so great could happen to us.

This is why it is important to find time daily to help deepen our faith and strengthen our relationship with God. When our hearts are burdened, heaviness weighs on our shoulders and words are not there. We can rely on our faith that through all things we can be confident our Lord is near. We are not alone.

When you know you can't do something; take a calming breath and rejoice in the God who can do everything.

It is also comforting during dark times and emptiness to have Scripture verses to turn to. It doesn't have to be a whole passage. Maybe just a line or two that you can hold on to when there's fear, sadness, anger, confusion....

These have been healing for me:

- ◆ I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. Philippians 4:13
- ◆ Cast all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you. 1 Peter 5:7
- ◆ Fear not, I am with you; be not dismayed; I am your God. I will strengthen you, and help you... Isaiah 41:10
- ◆ Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Matthew 11:28
- ◆ Only goodness and kindness shall follow me, all the days of my life. Psalms 23:6

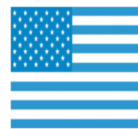
