DETACHMENT



One of the essential tasks of the Christian life is to detach from those things that prevent us from experiencing the totality of God's love for us and presence to us. The saints have written extensively about detachment in their own lives. Prayer, fasting, and other mortifications are excellent ways to detach from things that impede our path to God. In the readings today, we see the value of refusing to let our desire for wealth, power, lands, physical beauty, and even other people hinder us from being holy as the Lord is holy. St. Peter mentions how the disciples have left everything to follow Jesus. What are you willing to leave behind for the sake of Jesus Christ and the Gospel? What are you unwilling to leave behind? Asking these questions cuts us to the core and is a great measuring device for assessing our spiritual progress or regress. Effective missionary disciples are detached from the world, seeking to direct their own lives toward greater intimacy with the Lord and consequently, directing others to a deeper knowledge and love of the Lord.

Dear Parishioners,

In the Gospel, we hear about our Lord's encounter with "the Apostle who never was." After the rich, young man said that he had kept the commandments, our Lord calls him with the same words that He used in calling other Apostles: "...come, follow me" (Mark 10:21b). Yet, a condition of his vocation as an Apostle was put before him by the Lord: "You are lacking one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven" (Mark 10:21a). Christ was calling him to just as much of a detachment from his former life, as He did the others. Recall the reaction of Peter, James and John at the summons of Christ: they left their livelihoods behind them. Or what about Matthew and disposing of his profitable office as tax collector? The others had to leave something to follow the Lord, and with this rich, young man, Jesus was asking the same.

He does not ask him to sell his earthly treasure, as if it were evil in and of itself to have private property or wrong to be a person of means. No, the Lord asked this sacrifice of him so that his heart would be truly free to follow Him. As our Lord says: "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" (Mark 10:23) It is difficult, insofar as their concerns can be multiplied by what they have. For an Apostle, it is absolutely necessary to have a heart purified of such attachments. Have we not seen the evil capable of those fallen successors to the Apostles, when they are absorbed in the adulation and the world, its pleasures and riches? Our Lord wanted this young man's heart to know a greater freedom than what could be obtained in following the Law alone...and he wanted that young man to be an Apostle.

However, rather than embracing the freedom that the Sacred Heart of our Lord had desired for him, let alone the exalted vocation of being in His inner circle, he walks away. His conscience still calls him back to the Lord, exhibited by the sadness that overcame him as he went away. He did not walk away in jubilation. He did not walk away aghast.

He did not walk away angry. He walked away sad...perhaps even at that moment regretting his decision, but incapable of turning back, at least at that moment. Sometimes, it comes to mind, how did he react after hearing of the Resurrection? Let alone after Pentecost, when the nascent Church began to multiply greatly. Did he come back? Did the sadness still haunt him?

Perhaps he teaches us of not only a healthy detachment to the things of this world, but also the truth that we should not hesitate in following the call of the Lord. What would his life been, if he bore that purification well and remained close to Christ all the way through? How many more have followed the same gray line of mediocrity and "what if" in the life of the Church? May the Lord teach us docility to His action and call, so that we may not share in a regret asking "What if I had been faithful from the start?"

Next weekend, Fr. Victor Karls, C.Ss.R. will be visiting us to speak on behalf of Food for the Poor. Please welcome him, and thank you as always for your generosity in the various charities that you have assisted over the years.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May the grace and peace of Christ be yours at this time and always!

Annually, the next-to-last Sunday of October marks the Church's Eucharistic celebration for the Missions, **World Mission Sunday.**

In his message for this year's celebration on October 21, Pope Francis explains that "life is a mission." "Each one of us is called to reflect on this fact: 'I am a mission on this Earth; that is the reason why I am here in this world' (Evangelii Gaudium 273)," he writes. Focusing on young people, he notes: "In speaking to you, I also address all Christians who live out in the Church the adventure of their life as children of God."

I invite all the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis to see World Mission Sunday as a special moment to live out the mission we share as God's children, the mission to bring the Gospel to the whole world. I encourage you to be a "voice for mission" through your prayers and through the help that you are able to give in support of the priests, religious and lay pastoral leaders who work tirelessly, day in and day out, proclaiming the Gospel, building the Church, and serving the poor in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia and Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe.

The prayers and material aid generously given to the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith on World Mission Sunday, the Pope explains, continue to support the "preaching of the Gospel to every nation," thus "contributing to the human and cultural growth of all those who thirst for knowledge of the truth."

"Mission revitalizes faith," Pope Francis reminds us, quoting Saint Pope John Paul II in *Redemptoris Missio* (#2). May your commitment to the Lord's mission renew your faith and be a blessing in your life. And may you know of my personal gratitude for your generous response on this unique day for the entire Church, and throughout the year, as you are able.
