SOUTH CITY DEANERY PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION (PSR)


Registration packets are available for the 2018-2019 school year. We are accepting students in grades PK - 8.

Dear Parishioners,

As we hear from Wisdom, Divine Providence made humanity in His image and likeness and was not made only to be destroyed. Being weighed down by the burdens that come upon him or her, an individual finds it easy to give into the cynicism that sneers at the gift of life, and at times, sees little value of it. If we turn inwards and only focus on ourselves, this selfishness devolves into a malaise that can affect not only the individual who pains him or herself, but also those around them. I recall one elderly man from my childhood, who lived at the end of our block, who pretty much shut himself off from the world after his wife had passed. Regardless of the interventions of family and neighbors, there was the invisible barrier of grief that never left him, so many came to leave him in his isolation. Even the smallest gestures of politeness, as saying "Hello" as you walked by him, would be met with silence or a suspicious glance. Focusing so much on his pain not only robbed him of happiness and friendship, it also affected his family and those who lived around him. When he passed, it was sad that those final years could not have been better for him. While all could be sympathetic on the loss of his spouse, his choice to hold onto that pain was his own.

There are times, when the weight of the world seems to almost crush us, and it is especially at those moments, when we turn to our faith in God and the communion which we share with other believers to be our light and lead us away from giving in to the darkness. Like the synagogue official, Jairus, and the hemorrhaging woman in the Gospel, seeking out the Christ is what brings healing. While they were chosen by Providence to be opportunities for the Messiah to reveal Himself, they are examples of faith in times of concern and anxiety.

And along with searching for the Lord, works of mercy that draw us out of ourselves bring their own healing. As St. Paul reminds us, just as Jesus chose to set aside His glory as the Son for a time to

be poor with us so that we may come to experience His glory, Christians are called to be concerned with those who need help. While the gift of things that sustain life are important, it is really the gift of humanity that best raises those who have fallen in straits. This gift of oneself brings its own healing to the one who is giving. As we come to our Lord today, may we reaffirm our faith in a God who did not leave us in our misery, but rather embraced it even to death, so that we could share in His Life, and may His gift lead us to give of ourselves to others.

Let us pray for our nation this July 4th and for all those who have given their lives for her, and those who are now putting their lives on the line for our peace and security.
