## LOVE GOD AND OUR DEAR NEIGHBOR WITHOUT DISTINCTION

When I went through formation to become an Associate of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, I was especially inspired and felt a connection to their spirit and their charism. The dear Sisters and Associates continue to inspire me through their dedication of loving and serving. In the CSJ Consensus Statement, Sisters and Associates are called to "love God and our dear neighbor without distinction." Serving "the dear neighbor without distinction" means not only addressing the injustices but making sure we do so for every member of our society, even those who are most at the margins.

With the recent announcement on the rescindment of DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals), I felt helpless. I thought what can I do? I believe that answer came to me through a letter that was sent to me from St. Francis Community Services. They have been working hard on behalf of our young immigrant neighbors during this time of crisis. They are up close and personal with immigrant families. The letter mentioned the statement issued by Archbishop Carlson, calling for all to be attentive to the needs of the poor, the marginalized, and the vulnerable and to see the face of Christ in the migrant and refugee: http://archstl.org/node/4404978 Below are suggestions taken from the letter sent by St. Francis Community Services:

## What can you do to help?

Continue to educate yourself on:

- the issues surrounding current immigration law
- why comprehensive reform is necessary
- how our laws affect family unity and the dignity of our neighbors
- the Catholic Church's call (and Gospel mandate) to welcome the stranger in our midst
Pray for:
- a compassionate and just approach to immigration reform
- a change in attitude towards migrants and refugees - moving away from fear, defensiveness and indifference toward compassion and understanding
- our immigrant clients and other immigrant neighbors in the community who are fearful of these pending changes in our nation
- our SFCS staff members as they continue to
- invest extraordinary time and energy, month after month, to help those who we serve cope with the threats to their future

Thank you, St. Francis Community Service for these opportunities to educate and empower ourselves, and opportunities for prayer and reflection. Thank you, Archbishop Carlson, I appreciate your statement on our personal call to action, through our Catholic teachings.

Dear Parishioners,
In the Gospel readings of this and last week, we encounter the need for humility to be disposed to the grace and salvation won for us by Christ Jesus.

Last week, we heard our Lord say: "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways...As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are My ways above your ways and My thoughts above your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:8,9). This week, the Lord corrects the people of Israel who complained against Him: "Hear now, house of Israel: Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?" (Ezekiel 18:25) There are those times when we do wonder where the Divine Providence is leading us, perhaps even coming to the point where we find ourselves on our knees asking, "Why?"

Given that God has given us a free will so that our choice to love Him is authentic, we should accept that He allows for the consequences of our decisions to come to pass, whether good or ill. One of the greatest decisions humanity has made, was when we chose to not follow His Will in the beginning, i.e. the Original Sin. The dreadful effects of this rebellion we experience to this day, particularly in suffering and death. In His Mercy, God uses these very effects of our sin to become means of our salvation through His Son, who takes upon Himself these terrible consequences, and by the Cross, offers us new life. While we may still carry our own crosses, the grace that we receive from them conforms us to Christ. St. Paul exhorts us: "Have you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus, Who though He was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, He emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave...becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a Cross" (Philippians 2:5$7 \mathrm{a}, 8$ ). The consequences of our rebellion are "turned on their head," for God uses them as the means of our salvation. As Christ was exalted by enduring these trials, so we can be raised with Him
and share in His glory. Humility calls us to accept the way in which our Lord has brought us salvation and how He calls us to share in it. May the Lord strengthen our trust in Him!

October 1st is regularly the memorial of St. Thérèse of Lisieux, who is a great example of child-like humility. Although she had desired to be among the "great" saints, she came to recognize from reflecting upon the 12th and 13th chapters of St. Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians that not all are called to the same vocation, but that the Church is composed of many vocations, and every vocation comes from the love of Christ. She accepted that God's Will for her was not to be an apostle, martyr or great teacher within the Church, but rather a humble witness to the power of God's Love in the solitude of the Carmelite cloister. By embracing her vocation as a "little flower" in the great garden of God, i.e. the Church, Thérèse would be exalted after her death, and her witness and intercession would be the means of great conversions.

Finally, I would like to add my thanks to all who organized and assisted at our Parish Rummage Sale. It was a remarkable success that was the fruit of the generosity and sacrifice of our fellow parishioners! Thanks to all!
