**Dynamic Catholic, Alive!
– Love & Truth**

In the first reading today we hear that God has called each of us to be a “prophet to the nations.” This doesn’t mean that we all need to leave the country to share the truth of the Gospel. We can do it right here in our own hometown, and God will be there by our side. Jesus confirms this in the Gospel. However, Jesus also warns us in the Gospel that we may not be accepted in our own “native place.” Just as He didn’t let that stop Him, He doesn’t want it to stop us either. St. Paul gives us two important benchmarks to guide us and these are “Love” and “Truth.” We must always share the truth of the Gospel with love and truth, because we can’t have one without the other.

Dear Parishioners,

In the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, we hear a popular passage that is used during wedding ceremonies: "Love is patient, love is kind..." (1 Cor 13:4). Within this text, the Apostle is teaching his readers that the most important virtue is that of charity. While faith and hope are essential in their own right, they are fulfilled in heaven: "At present, we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present, I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known" (1 Cor 13:12). Faith brings us to believe all that God reveals, and hope leads us to trust in Him. In heaven, the blessed see God face-to-face, and faith becomes direct knowledge of God. Once in heaven, hope is completely satisfied now that we are in the possession of God. Love of God and love of neighbor remains in heaven.

Yet, it is not only in the fact that charity remains for eternity that shows its importance, but it is the ultimate indicator of our holiness and conformity to the God who is Love: "If I speak in human and angelic tongues, but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal [...] If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing" (1 Cor 13: 1,3). Some think that in order to prove that God exists or that they are close to God that extraordinary signs are necessary, but St. Paul explicitly states that it is our love that is the ultimate proof. While God, in His Providence, does allow for great signs to assist us in our faith as well as to bring others to the faith, it is in our exercise of charity that He reveals Himself each and every day. The devil can mimic certain signs to tempt people away from the truth, but he can never mimic authentic love of God and love of neighbor. Charlatans can use technology and other tricks to fool people that they have extraordinary powers, but only in love can any human person show how close they are to God.

Charity is not just a desire or emotion, but a choice to offer to God and neighbor our best for their own good. It is a choice to share a union with God and

neighbor that risks our own self-satisfaction for the benefit of another. It is a choice to go beyond ourselves, but in it, we find our true fulfillment. If we are made in the image and likeness of a God who brings Himself to be one with our nature and to suffer the consequences of our sins for us, how else could we seek fulfillment outside of the gift of ourselves for the good of others?

As we come to worship the Lord this day, may He increase our charity above all else, so that we may be confirmed in the knowledge that we are truly His People and that He is truly our God.

INFORMATION ABOUT SOUTH GRAND SENIOR MINISTRY SERVICES



South Grand Senior Ministry (SGSM) is a partnership of Catholic churches in south St. Louis providing a variety of support services for older adult members of the parishes as well as any senior living in the service area.

Currently there are six member parishes: Immaculate Heart of Mary, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Cecilia, St. John the Baptist, St. Pius V and St. Stephen Protomartyr.

OUR SERVICES AND PROGRAMS INCLUDE:

Transportation: Volunteer drivers take registered parishioners who don't drive to medical appointments during the week. A transportation coordinator fields the phone calls and matches riders with drivers. All drivers complete a background check (Family Care Registry) through the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. Riders are registered through SGSM staff members.

Educational Workshops: Our “Aging Wisely” series offers educational topics for seniors and caregivers, and often include lunch. The series rotates throughout the parishes in the ministry. Examples of programs are advanced directives, reverse mortgages, computer instruction.

Socialization: SGSM offers social engagement experiences through a Monthly Game Day, as well as day trip excursions on chartered buses. We have explored places such as Springfield IL, the Gateway Arch, Magic Chef Mansion, and Hermann, MO.

Spiritual Opportunities: Each year we host Lenten and Advent Days of Reflection with guest presenters to guide participants in deepening their relationship with God in these sacred seasons.

Stephen Ministry: This program equips laypeople to provide the emotional and spiritual care we need when faced with a crisis or difficulty such as loss of a loved one, hospitalization, chronic or terminal illness, aging issues and more.

Health Promotion: Free and low-cost exercise classes are available at the different parishes and open to all. Options include arthritis exercises and chair yoga.

South Grand Senior News: An informative newsletter with SGSM events and community resources is issued five times yearly and mailed to senior parishioners of the member parishes.

Staff Development Days: A retreat day just for staff members, as we focus on self-care and other techniques to implement with those we serve.

Volunteer Opportunities: SGSM offers active parishioners meaningful volunteer experiences. We recruit volunteers to drive seniors to the doctor, train as Stephen Ministers, label newsletter mailings, and plan programs and trips. Every talent is needed and appreciated!
