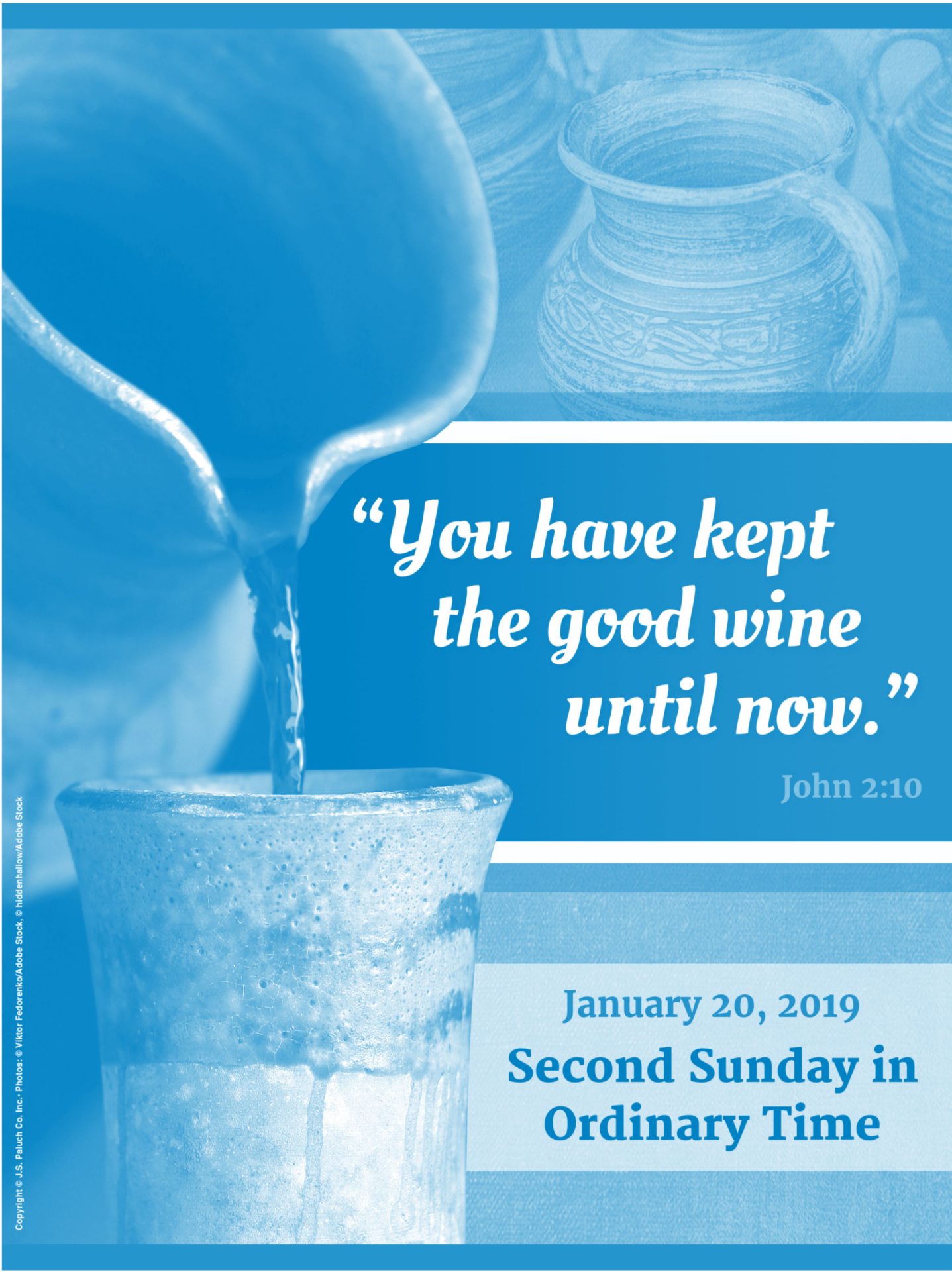

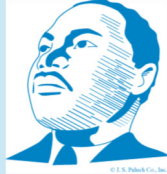

Dear Parishioners,

We hear of the first public miracle of our Lord at the wedding feast of Cana. It is evident that He had an established group of disciples already, but not all had a faith ignited within them. We see this at the end of today's passage: "Jesus did this as the beginning of His signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed His glory, and His disciples began to believe in Him" (John 2:11). The miracle of changing water into wine reveals His glory as the Son of God, who has power over Creation and can work miracles at will. It is only after this, that His disciples "began to believe in Him." While they were taken by His preaching and His way of life, their hearts had not yet received the gift of faith. Undoubtedly, they were open to receive this gift of faith, otherwise, they would not be following Him in the first place; but they needed more, or perhaps, God's plan meant for them to spend some time with His Son prior to giving them the faith.

The journey to faith that we see in these first disciples is repeated in many souls throughout the history of the Church. For those who are raised in the discipline of the faith from a young age, they are prepared to live the faith, but there has to be a time, when it is received in such a way that they are no longer living it solely in respect to their culture, society or family. In everyday language, some refer to this as "making the faith one's own." What is understood by this phrase, is that there is a time when one embraces the faith whether or not the external influences of family or culture are there to assist their ascent of faith. Having received the gift of faith from God, they embrace it and cooperate with it to believe in God and all that He has revealed. What this phrase should not mean is that faith is "owned" by the person like any other property, free to dispose of it or change it into according to their own desires rather than as given by God.

When we invite another into the faith, whether it be our children or some acquaintance, it is important to recognize that we are there to dispose them to the faith by our knowledge and capacity to explain it as well as how we live it. Ultimately, it is God's

work and the individual's openness to receive this gift. While the early disciples were following our Lord and hearing His teaching, they had to be open to cooperate with the gift of faith that they received, and there had to be a moment, when they were no longer passive, but offer their ascent of faith.

When we do give this ascent, our eyes are opened to the working of God among us and the many gifts that are offered to His faithful. St. Paul reminds the Corinthians of this in today's Second Reading. While there are many gifts, there is one Spirit who unites them all and guides them to their fruitful end. May the Lord grant us an increase of faith to not only open our eyes to His work and gifts among us, but our hearts to desire to fulfill His Will.
