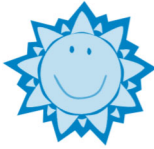

Dear Parishioners,

In this week's holy Gospel, our Lord reveals that it is His flesh that will be given for the life of the world, which will bewilder many of His listeners to the point that some will walk away from Him. Of course, those who turn from Him are convinced that they truly know Him: "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" (John 6:42)

Those who walk away do not see in Jesus anymore than the man that they had come to know growing up before them. The signs that He has worked already are easily dismissed by them, and they do not even recognize how great those are. He is merely the son of the carpenter, and that is all He is to them.

Thanks be to God for those who saw something more! Even though some might have not understood or saw the fullness of who He was, they at least recognized in the signs that He was someone more than just an individual who had nice things to say. He is the Messiah. Even those who have received the faith from others might find it difficult to embrace this truth that He is fully God and human. Thomas Jefferson is known to have rewritten the Gospels by omitting anything that he deemed as impossible to have happened...the "Jeffersonian Bible"...and he reduced Jesus to a brilliant moralist who lived a long while ago.

It is so easy for the human mind to ignore the truth, whether out of pride or sentimental desires. We put blinders on to avoid confrontation...or to elicit confrontation. We would rather deny the truth rather than face the facts.

If truth is the foundation of our freedom, as our Lord said it was, then only in embracing it will we know the freedom that He comes to bring to us. We can easily see in the world those who run far away from the truth, let alone those who enable them, as well as the "cages" that they build for themselves.

There is a huge disconnect from reality, and even though they may seem "happy," they are far from it. May the Bread of Life free us from those fantasies that block us from seeing Him as He is. May His grace convert our hearts to recognize what we have done and what we have failed to do as His children, so that the freedom He desires for us may be realized. May the new life that He has begun in us lead us to the fullness of life in heaven.

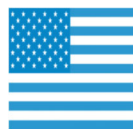
