## 20th Sunday of Ordinary Time

#### GIVING THANKS ALWAYS AND FOR EVERYTHING

The Gospel today is critical for our lives as Catholics, as it illuminates the truth of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Read John 6 again and again! However, since I touched on the first part of this passage last week, I want to focus on St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians today. In this letter, he provides us with a hallmark of the Christian life: rejoicing and giving thanks in all circumstances. We find ourselves in all types of situations during our earthly life. These include sick times and healthy times, sad times and cheerful times, times of defeat and times of victory. The crux of the matter is that we must always give thanks to God for whatever He sends our way. The apostles and early Christian martyrs rejoiced that they were found worthy to suffer for the sake of Jesus Christ. They glorified Him in life and death. Similarly, we are called to be a people who do not despair or embrace a cynical perspective on life in the midst of trials. In our workplaces, our families, our neighborhoods, and all our endeavors, we are called to manifest the goodness of God and the truth that He uses us to accomplish His will in all things. 



# **20th Sunday of Ordinary Time**



Dear Parishioners,

In the first readings, we hear of the importance of wisdom. This particular virtue was held highly in the ancient world, spurring on a particular field of study in philosophy, the "love of wisdom." For centuries, philosophy held a prime position in intellectual institutions and cultural centers, until our more "pragmatic" age that has tended to push it aside and dismiss it as little more than a glorified headtrip that does not deal with reality. In truth, though, it deals very much with reality and how we think of ourselves and the world. We all work from a philosophy of some sort, even though we may have not had official instruction in the various schools of thought. It is something that affects us every day, even though we may not realize it. From how we think about the human person, to our interactions in government, the marketplace and even in religion, some underlying system of thought directs our actions. Unfortunately, sometimes we just "go with the flow" of the prevailing philosophy without serious reflection as to whether it is valid or not, and when we begin to discuss or question things, we tend to devolve into emotion rather than actually talking about the matter in an objective way. Thus, even though philosophy is not regarded as highly as it once was, proves its importance by society's neglect of pursuing wisdom in an authentic and logical way.

Wisdom still remains high in our faith, which is rooted deeply in Sacred Scripture. It is stylized by Proverbs as a generous woman who invites all to leave foolishness and ignorance aside for what truly satisfies. St. Paul also draws the contraposition between the wine of the world that only satisfies the senses for a time with the gift of the Holy Spirit, who is the source of all wisdom. We hold it as that particular gift of the Holy Spirit that raises a soul to such a degree that it can contemplate God Himself. It is a light that sees all things from God's eyes, and therefore, as they truly are, rather than from our limited point of view as fallen and limited beings. It does not mean the cleverness of someone who knows how to "work the system" to his or her

advantage, nor is it the mere accumulation of knowledge. There are many who are clever and knowledgeable but lack true wisdom.

As we come before our Lord in the Holy Eucharist, He is like lady Wisdom who invites us to a banquet to know what truly satisfies the human heart. He gives us Himself to enlighten our souls to guide us along the way of Wisdom. May we pursue this gift and prepare ourselves readily to receive it from Him.

As we begin another academic year, may Wisdom bless administrators, teaching staff and students in all our institutions of learning!

# THE ROLE OF SPIRITUALITY IN A CAREGIVERS' LIFE

I read an article in the newsletter, *Among Friends*, published by the Friends of St. John the Caregiver. I would like to share this with you in hopes it may resonate with you or someone you know.

One of the last things a caregiver wants or needs is the pious platitudes about the spirituality of caregiving. Those saccharine, greeting-card sentiments with a religious spin often fall flat. Some of the "spiritual" things that get said to caregivers make matters worse.

Let's be honest: there are times in our lives when our spirituality is on the back burner at best. Spirituality-God, prayer, sacraments and all the rest-may not make the top ten list of our concerns when we're caught up in life's many demands. But there is some good news.

If you haven't been too spiritual before now (or if it has been a while), it's a small step for your "Oh, dear God!" to be transformed from an exclamation muttered in fear and frustration to a quick prayer... muttered in fear and frustration. It's God's presence that not only lets you take that small step, but also makes you aware you've done so.

What if your spiritual life is strong and active? When you find yourself in a caregiving role, you might feel as if you have put your spiritual life on hold. You can't make it to weekday Mass. You can't attend the prayer group meeting. You can't head to the retreat house for your annual weekend away.

But you don't need to "go there" to experience God in a very particular and personal way. God has come to you. Or, more accurately God-present with your care-receiver at this time in his or her life-has invited you to join him.

Now your spiritual life may consist of receiving Communion from a communion minister who has come to visit your loved one. Or it may be saying prayers and reading Scripture with your carereceiver-for the first time in a long time, if ever. Now God's presence may help you realize that a bedside, a car, or a doctor's office has replaced the retreat house for now.

Now you may realize that you and your loved one are on a pilgrimage. The bedroom, the car, the doctor's office all are holy ground, because the two of you are making a truly sacred journey. Together, you are preparing for what is to come: one of you will continue into the next world and one will remain behind. On that day one will grieve even when you know the other is rejoicing. And one will rejoice, even though they know that for a time her loved one is grieving. This can be a once in a lifetime experience; a walk with God that can never be duplicated or repeated.

These aren't pious platitudes meant to gloss over the realities of caregiving. You know the truth: Caregiving is exhausting. Caregiving is maddening. Caregiving is frightening. Caregiving is frustrating. But the truth is that in the middle of all that, you can experience an awareness of the presence of God.

Whether you feel it or not. God is constantly present with you in your new role. And whether you like it or not, you've been given an assignment, a mission, a vocation; you are a caregiver. ("Oh, God help me!" That's another good prayer). Love is the essence of caregiving.

As I read this I found comfort in the reminder that God is where ever you are. You are not alone. You can have every single human emotion and know that He is still there with his arms wide open. He will give you what you need and love you through each moment.

I would be honored to listen, talk with you, help find resources and services. If all you need is a confidential, non-judgmental listener, please call me. 314 -481-9385.






