Dear Parishioners,

Our Lord shows Himself to be the Good Shepherd, whose Heart is moved for pity for us, who are lost without Him. The profundity of the Gospel message and the works He had done in their midst touched a chord in the hearts of the people who heard and saw Him. It is that chord of the human heart that longs for reconciliation with God and guidance in doing His Will. It is that part of the human heart that resonates most deeply how much we desire the happiness that only can come from Him, insofar as we can only be satisfied by the Infinite Love of our Creator. While we may attempt to slake our thirst for this Love with lesser things, even though they may very well be good in themselves, they are not enough. There is no good on this earth that can match the Origin of all that is good. God is the only good that lasts for eternity.

With His Sacred Heart so moved for the people who took pains to see Him and His Apostles, our Lord offers Himself up to their needs. That is the Heart of the Good Shepherd; one that sacrifices Himself out of Love. This makes Him different from the false shepherds that we hear about from Jeremiah, who rails against those who “mislead and scatter the flock” of the Lord (Jeremiah 23:1). False shepherds mislead and scatter for various motives, but all of them retreat from offering themselves out of Love like our Lord. He is the true Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep (John 10:11).

For those who are called to share in His ministry as shepherds in His Church, they are called to the same. They are called to have hearts conformed to Christ's that longs for the salvation of souls to the glory of God the Father. Definitely, there are great examples in the life of the Church of those who have followed the Lord: St. Peter, St. Paul, St. Ambrose, St. Augustine, St. Francis de Sales, St. Charles Borromeo, St. John Neumann, etc. And unfortunately, there are those examples of great sinners and heretics who have used their vocation for things contrary to the Will of God, misleading

and scattering the flock in their wake. At the seminary, we tell the men about both and the effects left in the Church by those who follow the Lord and those who go their own way, and of course, we guide them to adhere to those habits and choices that will conform them more to Christ, understanding their own weaknesses and where the Enemy may attempt to turn their hearts away from the proper end of their vocation.

Of course, shepherding in the Church goes beyond those who participate in the fullness of the priesthood of Christ. It extends to all Christians who exercise any form of leadership or guidance of others, whether in the Church or in the workplace. Mothers and fathers shepherd their children; bosses guide their employees; teachers lead their students; military superiors direct their subordinates. While the world has its own policies, Christians have the higher calling of the Gospel to go beyond measuring their leadership according to the eyes of the world, but according to the Heart of Christ. And here again, in the life of the Church, we have seen those who have reflected the Love of Christ more than others, and we have seen the effects.

May the Lord grant us shepherds after His own Heart!
