WHAT IS YOUR PLAN?



Years ago Father Dave Polek celebrated Mass here at Immaculate Heart of Mary during Lent. He said a couple of things Taking stock that continue to resonate with

> "Don't give up hard candy, when you continue to hold hard feel-

ings against someone." Great quote Father Dave! Isn't that a dandy! I can see me standing before our Lord and Him asking, 'Why did you continue to hold hard feelings against John Brown? Why didn't you look for the good in him and find forgiveness in your heart?' And I will proclaim, "Lord, you must have missed it! That was the time I gave up hard candy instead!"

Wonder what Jesus is going to think of that one? What are we doing in our lives? Do we continue to strive to see the goodness in others? Do we try to have a forgiving heart? (Remember, forgiveness does not mean it was ok someone harmed you, hurt your feelings or did you wrong. It means you will no longer let their actions control your heart!)

This Lent may we spend time with Jesus in prayer. "Lord, help me be the person you want me to be. Crush my judging, grudge holding ways!' If you think, 'oh I don't do this, this is for someone else. I cannot come out of my comfort zone.....spend more time in prayer, just in case, Jesus may have a message for you. You may be right on target or there may be behaviors that could use a little tweaking.

As our Pope has relayed, Lent isn't all about, "What can I give up?" It is about being fully committed to, trusting and putting God at the center of our thoughts and actions every day, it is about being grateful and wanting to say thank you. By living a life of gratitude, we are on the right path towards God.

We do not have to "give up" something for God's love. Every single one of us always has been and always will be profoundly and unconditionally loved by God. He knows us and loves us more than we know and love ourselves.

Sometimes doing something as opposed to giving something up can be even more profound. Which brings me to the other statement Father Dave made that really stuck with me: "These days many do not have the alms to give, but what do you have?" Isn't that a great reflection question to ask yourself, not just during Lent, but throughout the year. Do you have an extra hour to offer as a volunteer? There are many opportunities at our parish and in

the community. Do you have a talent that your service provided would save our parish money? How about your closets or garages? Cleaning up the clutter and donating to St. Vincent De Paul thrift store on Kingshighway would provide for people in need and resonate funds to allow SVDP to do their good works. Gentlemen, do you have shoes or clothing that would clothe someone at Peter and Paul shelter? Place your donation in the bin in church.

Spend time in prayer. Talking and Listening. The Holy Spirit will guide you. Lent is a gift from the Church, a time to refocus, reflect, and......who knows where the Spirit may lead you! God bless your Lent!

Dear Parishioners.

The familiar Parable of the Prodigal Son once again is proclaimed by the Church this weekend, as she continues her Lenten pilgrimage towards the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. So many homilies and reflections have been written about this parable throughout the life of the Church, as it has captured the hearts of men and women since its first telling from the Lord Himself. Of course, we can understand why it is so captivating and an important glimpse into the mystery of God revealed by Jesus Christ. It reveals the mystery of sin, which entices humanity to use the gifts God has provided for its own benefit that ultimately ends in humiliation or a hardness of heart. It also reveals the mercy of God the Father, ready to embrace fallen humanity and raise it to a dignity that it does not deserve, but is freely given.

In both sons, we find a spirit of entitlement. In the younger son, this spirit grasps at the inheritance earned and given freely to him by the father, and he fritters it away without any gratitude for the one who sacrificed to gain it for him and his brother. In the elder son, although obedient and dutiful in his work, the spirit of entitlement rears its ugly head after the father shows forgiveness to the one who wasted his inheritance: only he should be the one the father offers such a celebration...and if anything, definitely not the one who has wasted so much of the fruits of the father's labor. As children of God, we recognize that we do not have a right or entitlement to abuse the good that God has given to us, even when it may have been earned by the sweat of our brow, nor do we have a right or entitlement to judge how God bestows His gifts and mercy on others... but how often does that spirit of entitlement tempt us? And how often is God ready to free us from the effects of such a domineering spirit so that we may know the dignity of being His children?

As we continue our Lenten way, we pray for an increase of a spirit of gratitude that may melt away the clutches of any sense of entitlement we may have, when it comes to the gifts we receive from

God the Father, and that such gratitude may increase a true love of God above all things in our hearts, so that we can be more effective in sharing the gifts of God, the supreme of which is the salvation we have through the complete self-gift of the Son.

As we turn a corner in this season, I wish to thank all parishioners who have engaged the spirit of Lent, as their perseverance brings grace to the whole community. I wish to especially thank those who have taken particular roles in our parish activities during this time to help us honor this season, and in particular Colleen Hoyt and all those who have assisted at our Fish Fry's, which have gone well. If you haven't made it to one yet, another is coming this Friday, March 11th. And I also wish to thank Deacon Jim Murphey who has led the 5PM Friday Stations of the Cross. Please God, all of our efforts may grant us an increase of grace and charity as we prepare to celebrate the Resurrection.

Our Lady of Fatima Promises all the graces necessary for Heaven if a Catholic finishes the Five First Saturdays Devotion. "Whether the world has war or peace depends on the practice of this devotion, along with the consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is why I desire its propagation so ardently, especially because this is also the will of our dear Mother in Heaven."

Sr. Lucy (March 19,1939)

During her July 13 apparition at Fatima, Our Lady said to Lucia, "I shall come to ask...that on the first Saturday of every month, Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins of the world." On December 10, 1925 Our Lady completed her request for the Five First Saturdays and gave great promise.

"....Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the First Saturday of five successive months, go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the Rosary and keep me company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary."

This Saturday, March 5th is the First Saturday of the Month, and there will be 8am Mass in the Daily Chapel, here at Immaculate Heart of Mary.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

The Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows: Good Friday is a day of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. On this day, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59.

Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted).

No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply. We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.
