Dear Parishioners,

In this weekend's holy Gospel, we hear the Beatitudes according to Luke, which include both blessings and curses. If one were to research carefully the covenants of the Lord with His People, there are both those fruits of faithfully adhering to His expectations as well as those effects which come to those who reject them. If one were to reflect carefully upon them, he or she would recognize that like a parent, God desires that we follow a path that truthfully fulfills our nature. Unfortunately, too many see that His Commandments or His Son's instructions should be considered a burden that is too heavy to bear, and therefore should be abandoned. Rather than following the Spirit of the Lord, they would rather follow the spirit of Nietzsche, who notoriously held that even if God is not dead, he would rather He was. They ultimately deny that God's nature is Love, for Love desires the best perfection of the other, and not its condemnation.

Many are confused by the fact that they hold on to the conclusions of human beings rather than God, as stated by the prophet Jeremiah: "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord. He is like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of seasons, but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth (Jeremiah 17:5-6)". Rather than trusting in His Word, they would rather accept the prevailing opinion of human opinion. This is like those who seek to push intrinsic evils upon the whole of society, and they do it without remorse, if not celebrate it. Intrinsic evils are those acts that due to their very nature could never be reconciled with what is good and right and true. It is unnecessary to even look to divine revelation to see how wrong they are, for right reason alone is enough to see the problem. When the light of faith is shown on such things, the evil is even more apparent.

It is important to pray and continue to reflect with both the light of reason and faith to help guide us in this life, for they are gifts from God to help us to find

the truth and ultimately Him and to love Him and come to share in His knowledge and love. As we come before the Lord today, we pray for His mercy to continue to guide us along the path and to lead others to Him.

MEDICAL ALERT PENDANT

Do you live alone or do you know someone in the parish who spends most of their time by their self? If there is a fall or another type of injury this scenario could prove to be dangerous. I cannot count how often I have visited someone who has fallen or other types or emergency who said, ***"I thought about getting Medical Alert but I keep putting it off."*** They also proceeded to tell me if they would have had the service at the time of their incident things would have been much better and not so frightening.

One gentleman fell and received several cuts and hurt his shoulder and leg. He pulled himself across the floor to the kitchen, but he couldn't get to the phone. God love him, he laid there for 17 hours before he could get help. I share this story, not to be frightening, but out of concern that this could happen again. Please consider having this service. **The average cost is \$30 or more a month.** Through South Grand Senior Ministry, we have located a new company who will provide this service without the need of a telephone. It includes a fall prevention option and GPS, so you may use it anywhere you go. Life Alert gave us the price of \$30, which we will gladly pay half through the ministry if the financial obligation is a concern. **It is that important that we want to help pay for it in order to keep you safe.** Any questions, give me a call, Debbie 314-481-9385.
