
# PRO-LIFE BAKE SALE!!!

Dear Parishioners,

Our Lord identifies Himself with a little child to teach His Apostles about leadership. He tells them: "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all" (Mark 9:35), and then He takes a child and says: "Whoever receives one child such as this in my Name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives the One who sent me" (Mark 9:37).

It is common among social animals to order themselves in some fashion. For any group to survive or complete an activity, there must be some order. How many times have we experienced the situation, where someone will make the comment: "They're all chiefs and none are braves." means, of course, that everyone wants to be in charge rather than getting down to business. When we all wish to go our own way, then nothing gets done. Of course, the opposite is also true. I am sure we have also experienced situations where, to use the phrase above, "they are all braves, but no chiefs," meaning that no one wants to take the responsibility of guiding the group, especially when the stakes are high, and one mistake on his or her part would brand him or her forever as the one who ruined things.

Our Lord's words are poignant for both situations. Where there are too many eager to be "large and in charge," His counsel that anyone who wishes to be a leader must seek the good of all others in the group before his or her own. When someone seeks to be the greatest for his or her own good before thinking about those whom he or she is called to guide, risks becoming a leader who devours, rather than nourishes. Where there are none who desire to shoulder the responsibility and risk of taking on leadership, the error is still the same: all are looking out for themselves rather than the good of all. Thus, His counsel that we should seek the good of all others in the group before our own should encourage someone who has the calling to be the leader, to make an act of generosity

While we may not have to take on the leadership of the entire Church, nation, military unit or company, most of us are called to exercise leadership in one form or another, where we are put into a position to guide a group of individuals towards a common goal. Our Lord's counsel is excellent for parenting as it is in pastoring, in society as at home, at work as in the parish, etc. We are called to seek the good of all more than safeguarding and promoting my own ambitions.

Faith can assist us in this, as we recognize that even in the highest offices in this world, we remain disciples, students and followers of our Lord Jesus Christ. This truth can humble us, as it reminds us that all of our endeavors should aim ultimately toward the glory of God. This truth also consoles us, that even at the most precarious times, our Lord is with us to guide us.

Finally, a big word of thanks for all those who participated in the Rummage Sale! Thus far, it has made over \$7000, and we are waiting to see what other proceeds may come in. Of course, it is not only the money, but also the stewardship and community built by such a work. Thanks to all!
