

Dear Parishioners,

St. James describes the Father as He who "willed to give us birth by the Word of truth that we may be a kind of firstfruits of His creatures" (James 1:18). This means to say that the Father has given us a new birth in the Spirit with the gift of His Son, and with that, we are those first offerings of an abundant harvest. The Word is like a seed that is sown within our souls that will save our souls, and the way we can tell that we are responding well to what we have received is that we not merely listen to the Word, but we must cooperate with it: "Be doers of the Word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves" (James 1:22). If we have truly received the Word into our hearts, there will be an affect within how we live and conduct ourselves. We are not merely passive spectators watching the drama of salvation being played before us, but we are immersed within the history of salvation. How we think, speak and act are woven into this reality that we call salvation, and where we end up at the final call, depends on how faithful we have been to the gift we have received from Christ Jesus.

Among the signs of fidelity to the religion that we have received from the Word are charity with those who are put aside by the world, let alone keeping our hearts and minds pure from the world, as St. James continues to teach: "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world" (James 1:27). In the Old Testament, there are many references to widows and orphans, who are symbols of all those left without assistance or protection. Without someone to sustain them, they are left with little means to provide for themselves, and they have to rely on the wider community to help them, until they are able to provide for themselves or are adopted by a family. St. James offers a practical and objective measure as to whether the practice of believers is authentic or not.

as to whether the practice of believers is true to God. The "world" in this sense is the fallen condition of humanity which only seeks to do what is good when it is easy to do, or if it avoids greater suffering from our present condition. For example, I go to work not as a good in itself, but rather as a means to avoid the suffering of poverty. Or another example: I worship God not out of love of Him, but I want to avoid the risk of Hell. And another: It is easier for me to sell out certain tenets of faith because it hurts the "feelings" of people I am close to, rather than seeing the greater good in those tenets of faith and challenging others to see it as well. There are various ways that we can take on the mind of the fallen "world."

May our Lord, through the intercession of our Blessed Mother and St. James, assist the faithful among the clergy, religious and laity in the here and now to manifest the glory of God through the authentic practice of the faith!
