Dear Parishioners,

For the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the Church contemplates the three divine Persons united in one divine nature and the various revelations of this mystery throughout salvation history. Early on in the Church, various theologians and schools of thought attempted to explain this reality that is beyond the grasp of human reason alone. Some ended up in heresy, such as Modalism that saw the Father, Son and Holy Spirit not as three Persons, but rather as three manifestations of the one God, e.g. the Old Testament was the mode of the Father, the Gospels and Acts relate the life of God in the mode of the Son, and with Pentecost, God comes to us in the mode of the Holy Spirit. This heresy pops up now and again, like many of the old errors tend to do. Have you ever heard anyone change the Sign of the Cross to be: "In the Name of the Creator, the Redeemer and the Sanctifier"? While the motive of this alteration may be something different, the effect is Modalist as it communicates that the Father is only the Creator, the Son is only the Redeemer and the Holy Spirit is only the Sanctifier, when in fact, the whole Trinity is involved in all aspects of Creation, Redemption and our Sanctification. There is a distinction in Their roles in these aspects, but They are involved nevertheless as they are always One.

For many decades, the early Church hammered out certain parameters of how to understand the Holy Trinity from what God has revealed to us about Himself, but it is often agreed to by most theologians that it is easier to say what God is not rather than what He is. This is not to say we can never say anything about who God is, but just that it is easier to say what He is not. He is not a "Super-creature" as some science fiction novels may purport Him to be, where He is not really God, but just a super-developed entity from the beginning of time. He is not "Impersonal" as some philosophers see Him, where He might be the Origin of Creation but one who never relates to His creatures. He is not the same as the Universe, as

To come to know God, we can use human reason alone to a certain point, such as in the truth that He exists, but how He exists as a Trinity is accessible to reason only when it is illumined by faith. Our limited mind has to be raised up to see God as He has revealed Himself to be. Faith assists our reason to see God, who we are in light of Him and the ultimate meaning of our life. While grace opens a path to embrace faith, we are called to cooperate with it. Temptations come from a variety of sources that may lead us away from that grace, and therefore, we can lose sight of God, who we are in light of Him and the ultimate meaning of our life. May our Blessed Mother be a sign and example of faith for us, especially during times of difficulty.

Finally, a happy Fathers' Day to all our dads and all those men who have been examples of fidelity, generosity and perseverance. May the Lord bless you all and strengthen your dedication to family and faith!
