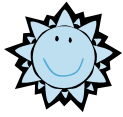

Romans 8:26

Jo Ann is a treasure! She is a kind, respectful, dedicated woman, who makes it a joy to serve with.

At each meeting we begin with prayer led by the Spiritual Coordinator. Peggy Kuehner has been diligent about providing us with prayers, Scripture readings and reflections. Her commitment has provided us with a spiritual banquet. At the meeting Peggy read a reading from Romans that spoke to me:

INCREDIBLE VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY FOSTER GRAND PARENT PROGRAM

The Foster Grandparent Program is a volunteer program for seniors to provide stable, caring, and loving relationships with children who have special or exceptional needs. As a Foster Grandparent, a senior volunteer serves as a role model, a mentor and a friend. Foster Grandparents volunteer at

Head Start Centers and transitional daycare facilities in the St. Louis area. They help children from infancy to 5 years old learn to read, provide one-on-one tutoring, and guide children at a critical time in their lives. No teaching experience needed. A Foster Grandparent volunteer gives the kind of comfort and love that sets a child on the path toward a successful future.

Foster Grandparents that are income eligible receive a stipend of \$2.65 per hour, and are entitled to vacation and sick leave time. Reimbursement for transportation can also be provided.

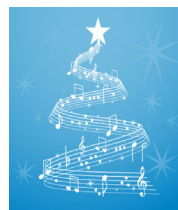

Dear Parishioners,

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy and my burden light" (Matthew 11:28-30). Some scholars tie this comment with the correction of the Pharisees and scribes in Matthew 23 insofar as He describes what they teach as burdens on the people. Some today might be tempted to use our Lord's correction as an excuse to absolve themselves from basic expectations from Christ let alone how the Spirit has guided the Church in her actual teaching. There can be a temptation to rationalize living according to the flesh rather than the Spirit, to use the words of St. Paul. Therefore, it is important to appreciate the context in which our Lord offers correction to the scribes and Pharisees, who ultimately do not share in His authority of interpreting the Scriptures or understand at heart what the Commandments are all about.

The scribes and Pharisees only concern themselves with the external conformity with the Law rather than what the Law is meant to be, namely the total conformity to the mind of God which results in the freedom of the soul who gives himself or herself to the Commandments. Sometimes, their interpretations of the Law even go against the Law. In Matthew 15, our Lord condemns the practice of children getting around the commandment of honoring their parents by declaring what they should be offering for the care of their parents as "korban" or dedicated to God. Although the children are technically correct that what is declared as "korban" is sacrificed to God alone, they are using this practice to go against the fundamental commandment of love due to their parents.

From such corrupted interpretations and duplicitous actions, our Lord offers to give rest to the poor souls who desire to follow the Will of God with a

correct understanding of the Covenant, let alone bring them to enjoy its fulfillment through His Cross and Resurrection. He speaks of His Heart as being that place of rest, for His meekness offers patience in the face of our weaknesses, and His humility reaches out to us who are creatures brought low by our sin. In His Sacred Heart, we find consolation as a sign of God's Love who takes upon Himself the weight of our sins to offer us a share in His life. Admittedly, there are times when it seems that His yoke is not easy or light. If we turn toward His Sacred Heart and recognize what He has taken upon Himself and what He offers to us, then we can find strength to persevere in our Christian life.

This week on July 13th, our parish will host the Fatima Symposium led by Msgr. Gene Morris sponsored by the St. Louis division of the World Apostolate of Fatima. Please God, our parish may benefit from hosting this event dedicated to the triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Finally, I wish again to offer thanks for those who helped with our Food Truck Party. Every time I read over the thank you's, I think of others to explicitly mention, and this time, I wish to thank the parish staff who helped work and clean up the event as well as the Scouts, who took time just before their camping trip to help. Thanks again to all!

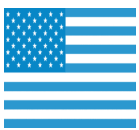

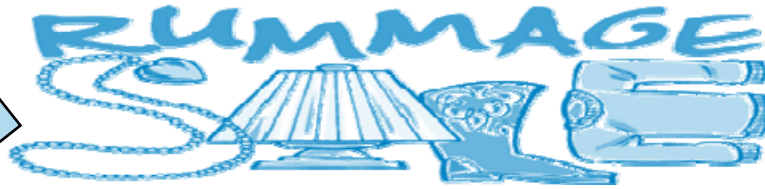
