Dear Parishioners,

Our Lord uses images easily understood by His listeners, when He describes the Kingdom of God as the grain in the field or as a mustard bush. Unlike His listeners, we know more through the advances of agricultural sciences the development of grain from seed to its full fruition, and so there can be something lost, if we superimpose our contemporary mind to those of the first century, which all too often leads to misunderstandings, if not taking offense at something that is not meant to be so. If we can bring our minds to match those of His listeners, we can see that there would be some mystery as to the growth of plants, though through their own observation and experimentation, they would have noticed patterns and what may help or impede growth: "...it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all, the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how" (Mark 4:26-27).

In describing the Kingdom of God thus, our Lord shows that it definitely has its observable qualities, but there are things which are not observable to the eye alone. We can understand to some degree how the Kingdom of God grows but given that it is primarily a work of Infinite Love, faith is needed to perceive it more clearly; and faith is needed to embrace it, even when it is not perceived clearly. Sure, one can see the fruit of its presence in the good works performed by those who are faithful subjects of the Kingdom of God, but the power that fuels such fruit and the grace that guides and nourishes human cooperation with it, cannot be seen by our physical senses nor by any instrument that may assist our senses. We cannot take a blood sample of a fervent Christian and use a microscope to find some physical element that proves his or her faith or the presence of grace active within the soul. The fruit of grace and the love of the Christian is evident through works, but the spiritual power behind those works need something more than science could ever detect, namely, faith.

Using the image of the small mustard seed that

grows into a large plant that can offer shelter to the "birds of the sky" shows how the Kingdom of God may begin small but will grow into something that all can find shelter or a home there. Of course, one has to freely enter the Kingdom. No one is forced to rest within it. May the Holy Spirit enlighten minds and hearts to recognize the gift we have in Christ, so that we may enjoy being part of the Kingdom that will last for eternity.

This weekend, we should thank all those who have organized the Food Truck Festival and participated in it to be successful: Aaron & Maria Buck and their children, Karen Garcia, Barry Hagan, Joan Mowery, Mick Smith, Tina Saputo, Tim Sullivan and the Mens' Club and Ladies' Sodality and the Quilters. Some of our original Food Trucks that were listed on the signs had to cancel due to mechanical issues, but thankfully Mike Smith was able to find substitutes. Hopefully, it will continue to grow and offer a seasonal event to welcome the neighborhood to our home and welcome back alumni and former parishioners who have moved over the years.

JUNE IS ALZHEIMER'S AWARENESS MONTH

Here are Some Early Signs and Symptoms of Alzheimer's (Continued from last week....)

6. NEW PROBLEMS WITH WORDS IN SPEAKING OR WRITING

People with Alzheimer's may have trouble following or joining a conversation. They may stop in the middle of a conversation and have no idea how to continue or they may repeat themselves. They may struggle with vocabulary, have problems finding the right word or call things by the wrong name (e.g., calling a "watch" a "hand-clock").

What's a typical age-related change?

Sometimes having trouble finding the right word.

7. MISPLACING THINGS AND LOSING THE ABILITY TO RETRACE STEPS

A person with Alzheimer's disease may put things in unusual places. They may lose things and be unable to go back over their steps to find them again. Sometimes, they may accuse others of stealing. This may occur more frequently over time.

What's a typical age-related change?

Misplacing things from time to time and retracing steps to find them.

8. DECREASED OR POOR JUDGEMENT

People with Alzheimer's may experience changes in judgement or decision-making. For example, they may use poor judgement when dealing with money, giving large amounts to telemarketers. They may pay less attention to grooming or keeping themselves clean.

What's a typical age-related change?

Making a bad decision once in a while.

9. WITHDRAWAL FROM WORK OR SOCIAL ACTIVITIES

A person with Alzheimer's may start to remove themselves from hobbies, social activities, work projects or sports. They may have trouble keeping up with a favorite sports team or remembering how to complete a favorite hobby. They may also avoid being social because of the changes they have experienced.

What's a typical age-related change?

Sometimes feeling weary of work, family and social obligations.

10. CHANGES IN MOOD AND PERSONALITY

The mood and personalities of people with Alzheimer's can change. They can become confused, suspicious, depressed, fearful or anxious. They may be easily upset at home, at work, with friends or in places where they are out of their comfort zone.

What's a typical age-related change?

Developing very specific ways of doing things and becoming irritable when a routine is disrupted.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU NOTICE THESE SIGNS

If you notice any of the Warning Signs of Alzheimer's in yourself or someone you know, don't ignore them. Schedule an appointment with your doctor. With early detection, you can: Get the maximum benefit from available treatments – You can explore treatments that may provide some relief of symptoms and help you maintain a level of independence longer. You may also increase your chances of participating in clinical drug trials that help advance research.
