

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend's Gospel offers the Lord's teaching on the sanctity of marriage, and the unity that is to exist between spouses who offer themselves to this sacrament. It is interesting how this is controversial nowadays, given the directness with which our Lord's words are recorded, but this is not His only teaching that seems to be ignored or disputed. Admittedly, there are many who do not enter into this sacrament with proper knowledge or with a full and free will, so it is understandable that the Church and the State offer recourse to an annulment process. Nevertheless, this does not change the nature of marriage to be anything other than what it was created to be as revealed by God: a life-long commitment of a man and woman to each other and with an openness to children.

Perhaps the controversy has really to do with a shift in various underlying elements that make up the structure of marriage. Yet, regardless of whatever age or culture ignores or undervalues as regards the fundamental nature of marriage, it does not change within itself. The foundational elements always exist, and it only remains for each culture or age to accept it in humility, if it wishes society to benefit from its goods, or choose otherwise. Very much like the dignity of human life, that dignity does not come from any group of people, but rather what it is in and of itself. Its dignity does not come the parents, the government, or any other human person. It is only left to each culture and age to accept its dignity, if it is to benefit from the gift that it is.

As we engage discussions about marriage, there is a temptation to devolve into appealing to emotions, which does not settle anything. It always seems to be a contest as to who can express the greatest moral outrage, rather than to actually get to the actual point of understanding what this great institution is. It is only with humility to the truth that we can understand it, and come to respect it for what it is.

As some of you know, the Holy Father has asked us to dedicate this month of October to praying the

Rosary daily for the Church, given what has been in the public eye for some weeks. He also added the St. Michael's Prayer and the oldest Marian prayer: Sub tuum praesidium. Given what needs to change and be addressed, appealing to a higher power is necessary, and it's hopeful that something more concrete will result. Thankfully, there is enough attention that it must be addressed more forcefully, and please God, our prayers will strengthen us to see this through.

This coming week, most of the diocesan priests of the Archdiocese of St. Louis will be having our periodic convocation, which I will be joining. Please pray for us and Cdl. Dolan who will be leading us in reflections on the priesthood.
