**LENTEN REGULATIONS**

The Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (Wednesday March 6th) and Good Friday (April 19th) are days of abstinence for all Catholics

over the age of 14. **On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59.**

Abstinence means refraining from meat.

Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply. We should strive to make Lent a time of prayer and penance.

Dear Parishioners,

In today's holy Gospel, our Lord alludes to a couple historical events known to his audience at the time. The first event of Pilate's wrath against some Galileans is not known outside of the Gospel of St. Luke, but given what we know from the ancient historian Josephus, it is within his character to do so. Josephus tells of two massacres at the order of Pilate: the first was the execution of many Samaritans, whose religious ceremony he had interrupted; and the second was a number of Jews in Jerusalem who rioted against his use of Temple funds to build an aqueduct for the city. So, if there was an occasion of a revolt against Pilate in Galilee, then it would be within his nature to do so. The second event was the collapse of a tower in Siloam, which fell on those nearby. Again, there is no other written account to date that we know of that tells of the same tragedy outside of the New Testament.

In any case, our Lord uses these two events to teach his audience that just because these tragedies happened to some of their kindred, it does not mean that it was due to their sinfulness. They were what they were regardless of the moral state of those who suffered them. While the effects of sin always affect those who commit them, even though at times in a hidden way, just because something evil befalls someone, it does not mean it was because they had sinned.

Nevertheless, our Lord continues, those who remain unrepentant will be judged accordingly and suffer the effects of their hardheartedness. The parable of the fig tree reveals how Christ offers us a path of mercy to once again bear good fruit to the glory of the Father. Like the caretaker of the orchard who makes attempts to make the fig-less tree produce again, Jesus calls to us to heal our souls that need to be sanctified by Him and healed from our sin. Unlike a tree that has no free will, we do... and if we choose not to receive the remedies from our Lord, then we will suffer the consequences. Our Lord's warning here, as well as the caution expressed by St. Paul to the Corinthians this week, are not so much to scare us into submission as to

inform us of the reality of the effects of our choices. If we grumble like the Israelites in the Exodus who rebel openly against God, then we should not be surprised to end up like they did.

On the other hand, if we do repent, then we can count on the mercy of God to return us to His grace and grant us new life. If we receive the cure of the Lord well and persevere in His grace, then we can count on enjoying the benefits of His attention and work within us. We can depend on Him to guide us through the desert of this life and bring us to the eternal Promised Land of heaven. It is our choice.

Finally, the Ladies' Sodality Trivia Night is around the corner, so if you have been thinking of joining us, now is the time. It has been an enjoyable event, since I have been your pastor, and I am expecting it to be once again. Please join us!

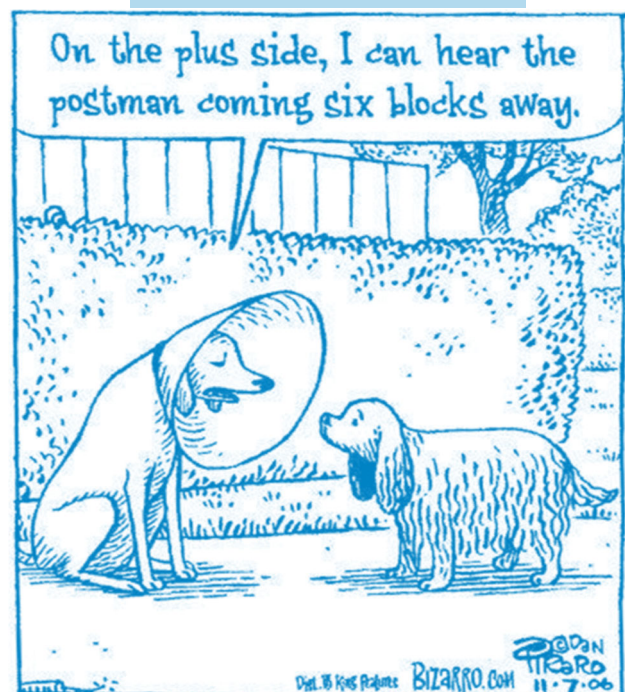
