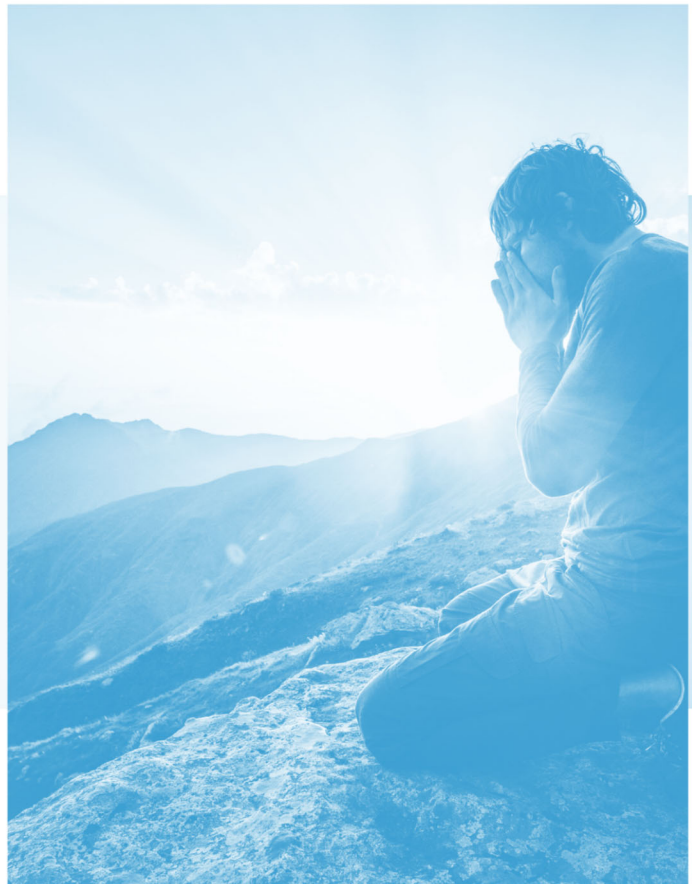

Dear Parishioners,

In the writings of the prophet Samuel, we witness the transition of Israel toward a monarchy from its reliance on judges to organize the tribes and make decisions over disputes. The first king, Saul, falls out of the Lord's favor, and so He raises up another, David. In the first Reading today, we hear of one encounter when David, who is being pursued as an enemy of the king, though he is innocent, spares Saul's life. While he had an opportunity to avenge himself, David respects Saul as the one first anointed by the Lord to lead the nation. Although he has offended God and failed to live up to the anointing that he has received, Saul retains the dignity he has received from the Lord. David tells his companion Abishai, who wants to end Saul: "Do not harm him, for who can lay hands on the Lord's anointed and remain unpunished?" (1 Samuel 26:9) David leaves it to God's judgment as to how Saul will be removed or punished for his sins. As a sign of his fidelity, he will show Saul that he had an opportunity to be rid of him. The complex relationship between these two would continue, until Saul falls in battle, and David mourns him.

This attitude of David, recognizing the dignity of Saul that remains even though he himself has not lived up to it, is amplified in the words of our Lord in the Gospel of Saint Luke today, where He offers the Golden Rule: "Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31). His followers are to see the dignity of the human person, even when he or she is acting in such a way that does not live up to that dignity. Even though evil may be done to us by them, as Christians, we are called to remind the offenders of their dignity by our reaction to their sinfulness. While we do not excuse what they have done, we are called to have them recognize that as human persons, they are called to something higher, and therefore leave an avenue of mercy open for them. Like David did with Saul, although he could have allowed Abishai to slay him in his sleep, he did not. He offered Saul mercy, so that he may be faithful to his own dignity as the king. Even though Saul chooses to continue to offend the Lord,

once he falls, David laments his loss. Similarly, our correction of others is to be ordered in such a way that they may recognize their sins and repent of them, hopefully leading towards a greater unity in peace. Again, this does not mean we rationalize their sins, but how we react to them is important to bring about conversion. We leave the ultimate judgment to God as to whether their destiny is eternal life with Him or otherwise.

As some may know, this weekend concludes a summit of the leadership of bishop conferences from around the world to address the responsibility, accountability and transparency of bishops in regards to the protection of children, in particular. Admittedly, I am tired of words and want results, and we must pray and sacrifice to that effect.

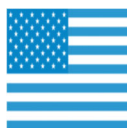

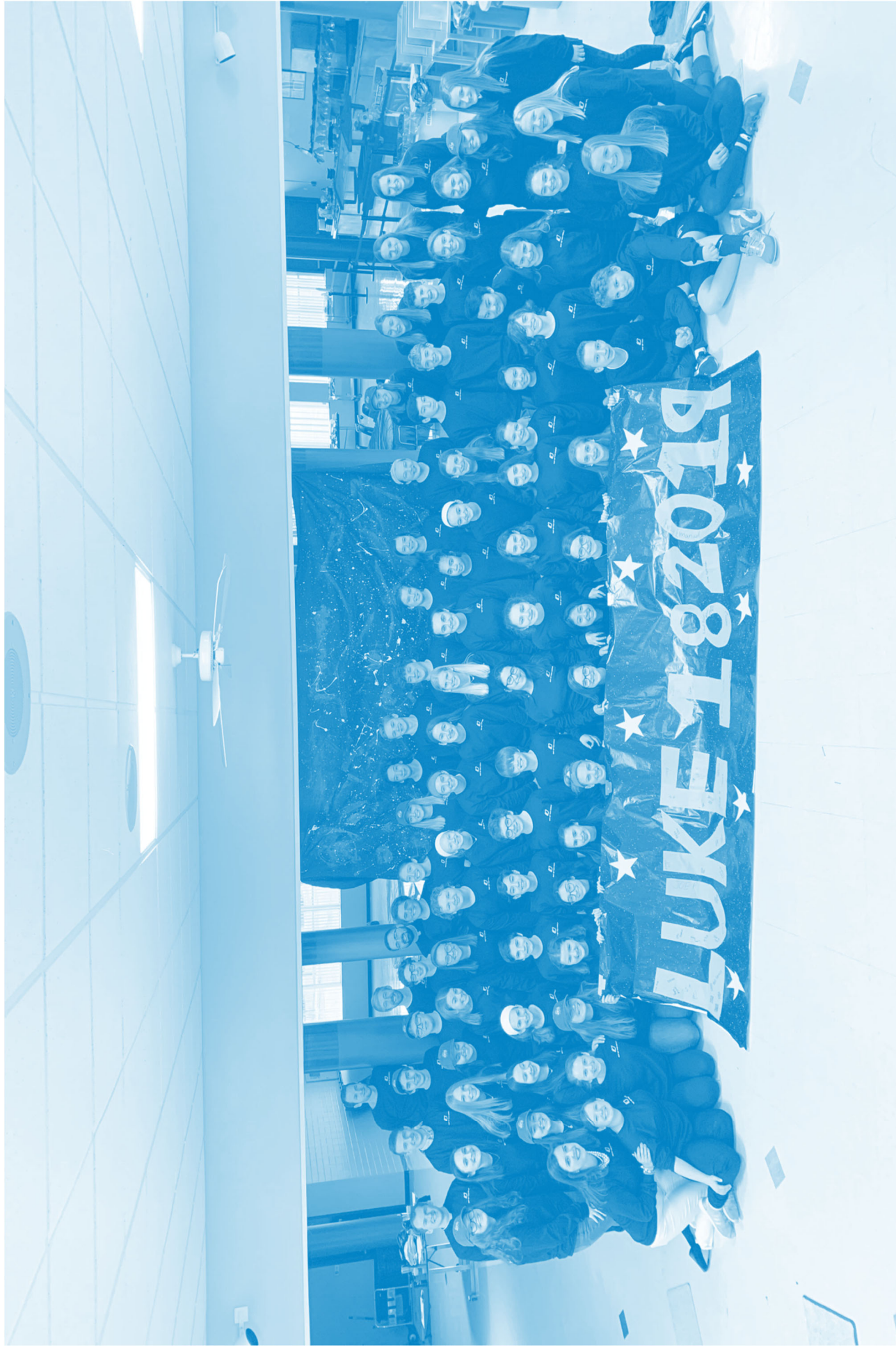
