Dear Parishioners,

In the readings today, we are reminded of the effects of humanity's rebellion against God as well as the hope in His Mercy: "With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption." Although we may experience our fallenness not only through temptations and moral weakness, but also, we ultimately will experience death, we believe with St. Paul that "we know that if our earthly dwelling...should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven." By the term "dwelling," St. Paul is referring to our bodily life, which will be transformed by God's grace to be like the glorified body of our Lord at the Final Judgment, and yet, even before then, there will be a dwelling place for us in His glory.

How we come to share in that glory is determined by our response to the guidance of God. When the Christ had come among us, some denounced Him as one who was possessed and under the influence of Satan, as we hear in the Gospel. To have witnessed the good that He was doing and say that it was evil was to deny that He was working according to the Holy Spirit. Those, however, who heard His teaching and received it well, He would call His mother and brothers: "For whoever does the Will of God is my brother and sister and mother." One would be His brother or sister, for he or she would follow the Will of the Father like Him. One would be His "mother" insofar as by obeying the guidance of the Holy Spirit, he or she would in a way bear Him new life. By following the Will of the Father and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, one is identified in an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. May our lives be a witness of the Gospel and bring others to new life in Christ.

Next weekend will be our second "Food & Fun at IHM" event with food trucks, face-painting, music, etc. Thanks to the committee members who have helped organize it and for all those who worked at this parish event that is meant to welcome others in the neighborhood as well as to re-connect with

former parishioners. Please God, we will have decent weather! Please invite your neighbors and old parishioners and alumni to the event!

Thanks to the Ladies' Sodality as well for their Quarter Auction, and especially all those who planned the event and worked to bring it to a successful completion.

Finally, as an update regarding our daily Mass chapel, the floor has been levelled and carpeting put in, but we are still waiting for the new chairs. It seems that the company had a dearth of orders a couple years ago, so they had to lay off workers, but then this past Easter, a flood of orders came in, so they are about a month behind fulfilling requests. JUNE IS ALZHEIMER'S AWARENESS MONTH

Here are Some Early Signs and Symptoms of Alzheimer's

Memory loss that disrupts daily life may be a symptom of Alzheimer's or another dementia. Alzheimer's is a brain disease that causes a slow decline in memory, thinking and reasoning skills. There are 10 warning signs and symptoms. Every individual may experience one or more of these signs in a different degree. If you notice any of them, please see a doctor.

1. MEMORY LOSS THAT DISRUPTS DAILY LIFE

One of the most common signs of Alzheimer's is memory loss, especially forgetting recently learned information. Others include forgetting important dates or events; asking for the same information over and over; increasingly needing to rely on memory aids (e.g., reminder notes or electronic devices) or family members for things they used to handle on their own.

What's a typical age-related change?

Sometimes forgetting names or appointments, but remembering them later.

2. CHALLENGES IN PLANNING OR SOLVING PROBLEMS

Some people may experience changes in their ability to develop and follow a plan or work with numbers. They may have trouble following a familiar recipe or keeping track of monthly bills. They may have difficulty concentrating and take much longer to do things than they did before.

What's a typical age-related change?

Making occasional errors when balancing a checkbook.

3. DIFFICULTY COMPLETING FAMILIAR TASKS AT HOME, WORK OR AT LEISURE

People with Alzheimer's often find it hard to complete daily tasks. Sometimes, people may have trouble driving to a familiar location, managing a budget at work or remembering the rules of a favorite game.

What's a typical age-related change?

Occasionally needing help to use the settings on a microwave or to record a television show.

4. CONFUSION WITH TIME OR PLACE

People with Alzheimer's can lose track of dates, seasons and the passage of time. They may have trouble understanding something if it is not happening immediately. Sometimes they may forget where they are or how they got there.

What's a typical age-related change?

Getting confused about the day of the week but figuring it out later.

5. TROUBLE UNDERSTANDING VISUAL IMAGES AND SPATIAL RELATIONSHIPS

For some people, having vision problems is a sign of Alzheimer's. They may have difficulty reading, judging distance and determining color or contrast, which may cause problems with driving.

What's a typical age-related change?

Vision changes related to cataracts.
