Dear Parishioners,

Having celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, which puts before us the central mystery of our faith, the Church comes to reflect upon how we come to share in the life of God, and that is through the sacred humanity of the Lord. Through the Incarnation, the Son of God takes upon Himself a human nature: body and soul. It is through this sacred humanity that we receive the revelation of God's truth. As He walked among us and preached the Gospel and did great signs, our eyes were opened to what God has willed for humanity. When His time had come, Jesus would offer the life of His human nature on the Cross as a sacrifice for the reparation of our sins, and this would be the foundation of a new and everlasting covenant. Unlike the covenants which preceded it, which were sealed in the offering of animals, this would be confirmed by the complete self-gift of the Son of God. While we may speculate upon the motive for making covenants in such a way, the bottom line is that God chose this means to make His final covenant with humanity.

In order that His followers and successive generations of believers might be united with this Sacrifice, our Lord institutes the Holy Eucharist and the new priesthood. At every Mass, we enter that moment of the Son's complete self-gift to the Father, and through Holy Communion, we share in that self-gift sacramentally. It is not that Christ is sacrificed repeatedly, but rather we are brought into the one Sacrifice of the Cross. It is a Sacrifice which transcends time and space, though it is offered within a sacred time in a sacred place. Eternity has entered time through the Incarnation of God as man, and through His sacred humanity, we who are creatures, alive for only a while on this earth, have an avenue into eternal life. Through the priesthood of Christ, we come to receive His very self. Again, we can speculate as to why He chose this way, but the bottom line is that God chose this as a means to bring us into His everlasting covenant.

In various parts of the world, where she has the freedom to publicly celebrate her faith, the Church

holds Eucharistic processions as a devotion to our Lord's Presence among us. They are professions of faith in the Lord's gift of Himself, and they assist those who participate in them to remember that His glorified Presence is accessible in the here and now. The Holy Father traditionally has a procession from the Cathedral Basilica St. John Lateran to the Basilica of St. Mary Major along the Via Merulana. For the sake of security, given the crowds and the unfortunate reality that some would want to use violence to make a point or to intimidate, a small altar is set in the bed of a converted personnel carrier before which the Holy Father kneels in adoration as the vehicle slowly makes its way to its destination. It is amazing to witness the faith of the people as they greet not the pope, but our Lord, waving kerchiefs towards the Blessed Sacrament and often shouting "Viva Gesu!" (Long live Jesus!). While some from more reserved cultures might think the display a bit dramatic, it is a beautiful testament of faith.

As we reflect upon the Lord's Presence in the Holy Eucharist, may we remember that it is a gift from God through which we may share in His eternal life.

June is Alzheimer's Awareness Month

Alzheimer's disease is a progressive brain disorder that damages and eventually destroys brain cells, leading to memory loss and changes in thinking and other brain functions. It usually develops slowly and gradually gets worse as brain function declines and brain cells eventually wither and die. Ultimately, Alzheimer's is fatal, and currently, there is no cure.

But neuroscience research efforts are under way to develop effective treatments and ways to prevent the disease. Researchers are also working to develop better ways to care for affected people and better ways to support their families, friends and caregivers. The Alzheimer's Association is moving these research efforts forward by funding scientists who are searching for more answers and new treatments, collaborating with stakeholders, fostering worldwide partnerships among scientists, and raising the visibility of Alzheimer's as a global health challenge.

Alzheimer's disease is the most common type of **dementia**, a general term used to describe various diseases and conditions that damage brain cells. **Alzheimer's disease accounts for 60 to 80 percent of dementia cases.** Other types include **vascular dementia, dementia with Lewy bodies and frontotemporal dementia.** In some cases, a person may have more than one type and are said to have mixed dementia.

The most common early symptom is difficulty remembering newly learned information because Alzheimer's changes typically begin in the part of the brain that affects learning. As Alzheimer's advances through the brain it leads to increasingly severe symptoms, including disorientation; mood and behavior changes; deepening confusion about events, time and place; unfounded suspicions about family, friends and professional caregivers; serious memory loss and behavior changes; and difficulty speaking, swallowing and walking.

Receiving a diagnosis of Alzheimer's can be frightening. Seeing a loved one progress with Alzheimer's is so painful.

"May we pray for all who suffer from this debilitating disease and for their families who lose their loved ones in bits and pieces. Lord, bless them with perseverance, trust and peace of mind. Amen."
