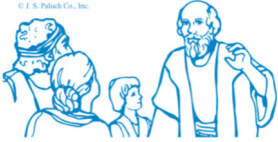

SUFFICIENT GRACE FOR EVANGELIZATION

We are reminded in the First Reading that God sends us to rebellious and obstinate people sometimes in order to bring the Good News to them. When we seek to evangelize others, we might encounter coldness and even hatred. These trials and others remind us, as St. Paul does, that God's grace is sufficient to sustain us through our earthly pilgrimage. Evangelization is the work of the Holy Spirit, and so we must remember that our job is to obey the promptings of the Holy Spirit, bringing the truth and the love of Jesus Christ to those who need it. It is not about boosting our own egos or seeing how many souls we can win by means of our own ingenuity. We must rely on God's assistance and not be discouraged if we are met with confrontation and insults due to a lack of faith of the ones we meet. Even Jesus was amazed by the lack of faith of some people in His time and native place, as the Gospel of Mark mentions today. Be patient and trust in God's grace.

Dear Parishioners,

St. Paul confesses of his own imperfection; a “thorn in the flesh” that tempts him. Having prayed to the Lord to remove this, he hears: “My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness” (2 Corinthians 12:9a). While we do not know what his immediate reaction was, it is evident that he comes to humbly accept these words: “I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me” (2 Corinthians 12:9b). Grace has formed his heart to patiently bear the hardship of his weaknesses so that the grace of Christ already at work in him may continue to do so. Not only does St. Paul come to embrace his weaknesses as a means to come closer to Christ, but he continues: “Therefore, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and constraints, for the sake of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong” (2 Corinthians 12:10). This seems illogical, but if one understands that we are conformed more to Christ by relying on His grace more than by our own power alone, we recognize that the hardships that come from within, such as our weaknesses, or those that come from without, like persecutions, that they are opportunities to grow in holiness.

St. Therese of Lisieux would compare herself to a toy in the hand of God or like a small flower in His garden, showing a recognition of utter dependence on Him. Rather than shrinking from weaknesses, she saw them as ways to rest upon Him all the more. This humility is characteristic of authentic Christian spirituality. St. Francis de Sales once asked that when we become angry at our failure or sin, is it because we have offended God, or is it rather that our pride is hurt that we have such weaknesses? Are we disappointed because we have sinned, or are we truly irritated that we cannot present ourselves as pure before God that we pride ourselves to be? St. Paul recognized this seeing that the reason why the “thorn” was given to him was so that he would not become “too elated” (2 Corinthians 12:7).

A tendency in contemporary culture twists this humble recognition of weakness in St. Paul in a very subtle way to actually inflame our pride. Rather than seeing a weakness as a weakness, popular culture will say it is not a weakness, but a strength, and something to be proud of. As our Lord said, only the truth will set you free, and if we do not recognize the effects of original and personal sin within us for what they are, then we are deluded into thinking that they are good, and consequently, we do not need a Savior upon whom to rely for perfection.

Finally, a big thanks goes to the Archdiocese for negotiating a contract with Republic Services which will significantly reduce costs for participating parishes. We will only pay around a third of what we have done with the previous company. Thanks especially to Ann Donohue for spotting the deal and getting it set up for us. On that note, if you should see anyone using our bins for their own rubbish, please let them know that they are for parish use only. The evening before the Food Truck Festival, someone filled up the bin so much, that it was almost full. OK, enough trash talk. Have a good weekend!
