LENTEN REGULATIONS

The Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (Wednesday March 6th) and Good Friday (April 19th) are days of abstinence for all Catholics

over the age of 14. **On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59.**

Abstinence means refraining from meat.

Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply. We should strive to make Lent a time of prayer and penance.

Dear Parishioners,

From the Book of Genesis, we hear of God making a covenant with Abram, who will be named Abraham, signifying that he has received a new mission in this life, and therefore a new identity and a new name. Our contemporary mind may find it difficult to understand the way in which the Lord made the covenant, given that we live centuries upon centuries after Abram, let alone in quite a different culture. In his time, a covenant could be made by the sacrifice of an animal, which was split into two parts. Those entering the covenant relationship would pass between the two parts, signifying the recognition of their responsibilities to the new bond as well as the effects of breaking the bond, likened to the split halves of the animals. There is the blessing of union in the covenant, and there is a curse for breaking it. In the Covenant of Abraham, the Lord offers a Promised Land, set apart for his descendants, which would be the place where God would prepare a People among whom He would send His Son. Abraham offers his faith and his descendants to the Lord.

Unfortunately, we know that the descendants of Abraham broke this covenant and suffer its consequences, but in the end, the satisfaction for offending God could only be paid for by God Himself, and thus, God the Son takes on our human nature from the stock of Abraham and offers His own life on the Cross. It is through Christ that we have access to the true Promised Land, which is heaven itself. It is this faith in the power of the Blood of Christ that inspires St. Paul to exhort the Philippians to remain faithful to the true Gospel. He mourns those who "conduct themselves as the enemies of the Cross of Christ" (Philippians 3:18). The immediate context of his warnings entail both those who are called "Judaizers," meaning that those traditions and practices of the Jewish faith were to be maintained in the Christian community, even though they had been fulfilled by Christ, as well as those who were "Gnostics," who would disdain the idea that God really suffered for our sins. Both represent distortions of the full Gospel.

This weekend, given the roots of our local traditions

from the Irish culture, we also call to mind the figure of St. Patrick. While he did not fight against Judaizers or Gnostics, he did have to contend with errors about the understanding of humanity, God and the world. From all the accounts have been handed down to us, the most consistent and uncontended elements that have always drawn my attention is that he desired to evangelize the very people that kidnapped him as a youth. Rather than harboring ill-will of those pirates or their peoples who forced him into labor away from his home, St. Patrick bore an affinity and desire for the Irish people to come to know Jesus Christ, and it was for this that he spent his adult years. Now, it seems that we need to call upon this holy Bishop for Ireland, if not also for the Church in the U.S. that the Gospel may be fully lived.

Thanks to Colleen Hoyt and all those volunteers that have kept our Fish Fry's going! It has always been a good time for fellowship in any parish to come together.

Finally, we add another congratulation on Deacon Jim as he continues to celebrate his 70th birthday, which was on Mardi Gras this year. God bless!
